Pets

Behaviour Targets

LANGUAGE (being kind and respectful in what they say to others face-to-face or on-line. No inappropriate or nasty words or name-calling). **LISTEN** (to listen with respect to others, and especially adults, during learning or when an adult

is trying to sort out a problem during play). WALK (when indoors to walk at all times. Do not run in corridors or across the hall to avoid accidents and make

sure the school is calm).



Modelling good behaviour

All adults and older siblings who enter the school premises must model good behaviour to our children at all times. That includes be careful that we use appropriate language and act in a respectful and caring way towards everyone. If there are any disputes please speak to a staff member who will ensure things are dealt with in an appropriate way. Any adults or older children who do not respect the rules and conduct of the school are likely to face a short-term ban from the school grounds which could become a permanent ban or prosecution if there is a failure to comply.

OPAL

As part of our OPAL programme, this half term we will be focussing on small world play. If anyone has any small world loose parts they would like to donate to school we would be very grateful. These could include small figures, animals, dinosaurs, vehicles, trains, track. If you have anything at home which you are not sure about please let us know as we can use most things.

Teacher Strike Days

As mentioned in previous messages and letters it is very likely there will be Strike action taking place on Tuesday 28th February (next week) depending on the outcome of national negotiations over the weekend.

If the strike goes ahead the majority of classes will be closing due to the strike action and this is a decision based on risk assessments we have carried out for each class.

We will send out a Class Dojo message telling you which classes are closing if and when we find out.

A further letter will be posted on Class Dojo outlining more details.

Clearly this is a difficult situation, which will cause some disruption. I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days thev are strike. that on School will be open as normal for all the other days of the week for all children of all classes.

The attendance record of the children will not be affected as it will be classed as an exceptional circumstance.
