Phonics Shed and Spelling Shed

As a whole school we have received training in new linked Phonics and Spelling schemes which the children can access at home. Details are being sent out if they have not been sent out already.

Children in Early Years to Year 2 will have daily phonics sessions based around the Phonics Shed scheme and their reading books will be matched to the phase of phonics they are working at.

There are lots of fun activities and the children are enjoying the way the new schemes are supporting their learning.

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COVID Update/Clarification

Just to make you aware we have had LESS positive cases in school this week and last week compared with 2 weeks ago and we are no longer in an 'outbreak' situation.

Thank you for being vigilant and doing your bit to help us keep safe.

I have been in touch with Track and Trace (119) and with the Lancashire COVID advice team and with the DfE because some parents have been getting negative PCR tests but sent isolation notes by Track and Trace.

The advice they have all given me is that the guidance now is that if a child gets sent an isolation note but has a negative PCR test they are ok to come to school according to the guidance but the parent must contact Track and Trace to tell Track and Trace that they have received a negative PCR test and they will give advice before you ignore the Isolation not.

Pupils can only come to school if they do NOT have symptoms.

The current guidance also says that anyone in close contact with a positive case should go for a PCR test but CAN still attend school while waiting for the test result.

I realise this is opposite to the advice in the summer but that is the guidance being given.
