<p><b>Arcade</b> - an indoor area containing game machines.</p> <p><b>Bay</b> - a place where the coast bends inwards and the sea fills the space.</p> <p><b>Beach</b> - a pebbly sand or shore next to the sea.</p> <p><b>Coast line</b> - where land meets the sea.</p> <p><b>Cliff</b> - a steep rock close to the sea.</p> <p><b>Erosion</b> - the process of eroding (gentle destruction) by wind, water or other natural agents.</p> <p><b>Fairground</b> - a place where there are rides, stalls and shows.</p> <p><b>Harbour</b> - a place where boats can stay safely in the water when not at sea.</p> <p><b>Lighthouse</b> - a tall tower with a bright light that warns ships about rocks and other dangers.</p> <p><b>Pier</b> - a structure that is built out in the sea for people to walk along.</p> <p><b>Promenade</b> - a paved, public path near to the front of the sea.</p> <p><b>Rock pool</b> - a pool of water among rocks, typically along the shoreline.</p> <p><b>Sand dunes</b> - hills or mounds of sand.</p> <p><b>Shingle</b> - a lot of small stones by the edge of the sea.</p> <p><b>Human features</b> - buildings or areas of land made by humans.</p> <p><b>Physical features</b> - features that were already there.</p>	<p>Brighton</p> <p>Blackpool</p> <p>Dartmouth</p> <p>Llandudno</p> <p>Morecambe</p> <p>Scarborough</p> <p>Skegness</p> <p>Weston-super-Mare</p> <p>Weymouth</p> <p>Whitby</p>
