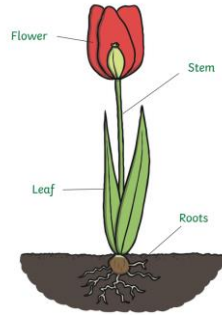

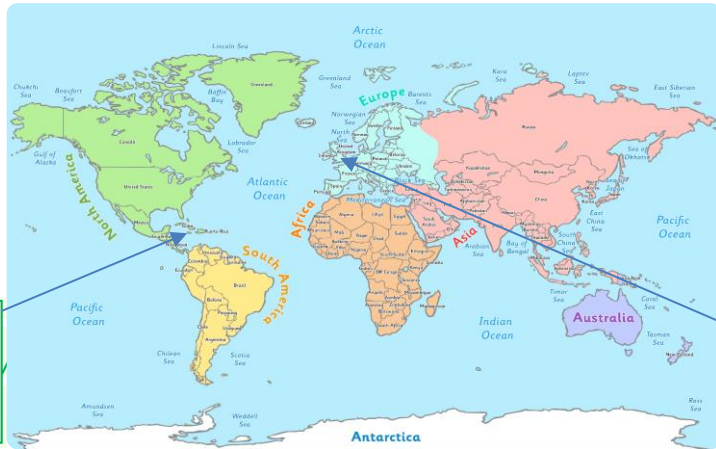


Emily was an English suffragette who fought for votes for women in Britain in 1913.

Vocabulary

Definition

Seasons	There are four seasons each year, autumn, winter, spring and summer.
Autumn	In Autumn, the weather begins to get colder and the leaves start to fall from the trees. The amount of daylight becomes less.
Winter	In winter, the weather is much colder. Sometimes it is cold enough to freeze. The daytimes are the shortest in the year and night times are the longest.
Spring	In spring, the weather starts to become warmer. Lots of plants start to grow and animals have babies.
Summer	In Sumer the weather is hot and sunny. The daytimes are the longest in the year and the night times are the shortest.
