

Homework

Homework is a crucial part of a child's education but we think there are more effective ways of doing homework than sending lots of sheets home every week for children to complete (and we realise that it can be a battle for some families to get it done).

We will still be doing homework but in a different way and will let you know very soon what is happening. We still expect children to read every day, practice their number bonds (times tables, division facts and numbers that go together to make 10, 20 etc.)

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Dropping off and picking up younger children

Please bring your child (if they are Reception up to Year 3) to the door/gate when dropping off in case there are any crucial messages and to make sure they have arrived safely and are picked up safely (some parents are dropping children at the road and expecting them to walk in themselves)

Children from Year 4 upwards are allowed to walk home and come to school on their own **with your permission** (you need to tell us) and only if we think the child is sensible enough to do so.

If a child in Years 4, 5 or 6 is not being sensible we will ask parents to supervise and escort their child.

Playground safety (start and end of day)

Members of staff will be coming out onto the yard in the mornings at the start of the day and end of the day from the beginning of next week (we are purchasing some high-vis jackets so the children can see where we are) so that we can ensure the children are safe. We are happy to chat but our main focus is the make sure the children and parents are safe and calm.



School uniform

The children have all looked very smart on their first day back. Please remember that black shoes are a crucial part of the school uniform.
