How can I help / information for Helping

- Ask your child to make predictions about their reading book. What do you think will happen next? Why do you think this?
- Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book what do you think this word means?
- Model reading a sentence to your child fluently before asking them to repeat it. This process helps to build confidence in reading fluently and accurately.
