All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:

How did people in the past protect themselves?

English	Maths
<ul> <li>We will be developing our knowledge of the correct terminology for the techniques we use within our writing and will also be continuing to develop sentence structure.</li> <li>Our focus in English will link to our History topic as we explore the life of Mary Anning, an English palaeontologist who became famous for discovering prehistoric fossils.</li> <li>The children will read both fiction and non-fiction texts about Mary Anning and they will compare and contrast the features of these. They will study non-chronological reports and conclude their writing unit with their own piece.</li> <li>We will then move onto Debate where the children will prepare arguments for and against the motion 'Should children on the 'Naughty List' receive Christmas Presents?'</li> <li>Handwriting is a key focus this year and we will continue to work to practise our first joins to develop fluency, which will allow us to write with ease.</li> <li>Spelling sessions will take place daily in which the children will build upon their knowledge of phonics and spelling patterns.</li> <li>The texts we will focus on are: Stone Girl Bone Girl by Laurence Anholt.</li> <li>The outcome will be: to write an informative report about the life of Mary Anning.</li> </ul>	understanding of multiplication and division. Applied through: practical sessions	Focus is: The focus this half term is Mental Health and Wellbeing with a focus on friendship.  Skills / knowledge to be developed: This theme focuses on developing children's knowledge and understanding of friendship, how we make friends, what makes and good friend and how we can protect friendships and resolve conflicts when we do fall out. We will look at three key social and emotional aspects of learning: empathy, managing feelings, and social skills which we will explore through circle time.  Applied through:  Discussion / Circle time / debate	Focus is: How do we make good choices?  Skills / knowledge to be developed: In R.E this half term we will explore how people face moral choices, beginning with a consideration of what makes a happy classroom and why rules are important. We will then find out about moral codes from Christianity and Islam including the Ten Commandments and the Five Pillars.
