Bramham Shadwell Federation Class 1 November – December 2022



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:

'How did people in the past protect themselves?'

English	Maths	
 Class One will be using the text QPootle5 to write adventure stories about space. We will be focusing on consolidating our understanding of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in sentences as well as applying our phonics when writing words. In phonics we will continue to consolidate Set 2 sounds as well as introducing the new Set 3 sounds. Children will continue to read daily in class applying the taught sounds to their reading. Later in the half term we will turn our attention to letter writing as we will write a letter to the alien QPootle5 before writing our own letters to Santa for Christmas. 	 This half term the children will be continuing to consolidate their understanding of addition and subtraction within 10. They will be making up their own number stories and solving picture problems to aid their learning. They will continue to use ten frames and the part part whole model to solve problems and check their answers. We will then be moving onto numbers to 20, both counting and writing. The children will be looking at place value, recognising, for example, what the '1' and the '5' in '15' signify. Correct numeral formation will continue to be a focus. We will also be investigating positional language. 	
How can I help / information for Helping Encourage your children to write their own stories about space, write silly stories together or write letters to people and post them. When reading books with your child, ask them to find the beginning and end of a sentence on a page. Can they point to a word? Can they point to a letter? Discuss punctuation such as full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and speech marks. Spot the new digraphs in books you are sharing, on items around the house etc.	How can I help / information for Helping Count objects to 20 with your child – can they reliably count out up to 20 objects from a group or tell you how many books are on the shelf, for example? Focus is: Neil Armstrong and the Apollo 11 mission Skills / knowledge to be developed: This half term we will be learning about Neil Armstrong's life and the 1969 Moon Landing. The children will create a fact file about the mission, imagine how Neil Armstrong felt when he went to the moon and learn of other important space milestones.	Focus is: Animals including humans Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will be finding out about different types of animals (such as mammals, amphibians and reptiles, carnivores, omnivores and herbivores) and comparing them. Applied through: Observation and research of different species, particularly those native to the United Kingdom.	Focus is: Ball skills Skills / knowledge to be developed: Kicking skills. Applied through: Children will develop their techniques to enhance their co-ordination and will play a variety of games in small teams.
How can I help / information for Helping Can anyone in your family remember the moon landing? Discuss and share memories with your child. Look at the sky at night – what shape is the moon? Do you know any of the stars or planets?	Spot birds and animals in your garden or at the park. Talk about the animals that you see in books or on the television. 
