All our learning in class this half term will be focused around:
Traditional Stories and Festivals

Communication, Language and Literacy

This half term the children will focus on the traditional story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. They will learn about Bonfire night, staying safe and the festivals and celebrations of Diwali, Hanukkah, Christingle and Christmas.

- The children will listen to a poem about Bonfire night and write words linked to the sounds fireworks make. The children will also discuss how to stay safe on and around Bonfire night.
- The children will learn about the festival of Diwali and retell the story the Rama and Sita.
- The children will be writing Christmas lists, cards and a letter to Santa's elves.
- The children will be retelling the Christmas story and will put on a nativity production for the parents, which we are all very excited about!

How can I help / information for helping

- Discuss vocabulary with your child when reading stories at night time.
- Practise accurate letter formation. If your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.

Mathematical Development

This half term we will continue to develop the children's understanding of numbers and counting through specifically focusing on one number at a time. This term we will be exploring the numbers 3,4 and 5 and will focus on;

- Recognising patterns within the numbers using a range of resources.
- Counting irregular groups of objects and recognising numbers to 5.
- Finding more/ less than a particular number/ amount.
- Calculating which two numbers make a given total using objects/ numicon plates.
- Doubling, halving and sharing.
- 2D Shape will be taught alongside number. The children will be encouraged to describe and name 2D shapes. For example, a rectangle has two long sides and two short sides: 2 and 2 makes 4. How many sides do two squares have? How could you find out?

They will be moving safely on and around apparatus. The children will learn to perform the tuck, straddle and pike positions on apparatus or mats. The children will incorporate these movements into a small routine.</p> <p>We will provide exciting fine motor activities within the classroom for the children to access.
