Class 2 - April 2022



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:

Can I make a difference?

English

- The focus will be on the revision of grammar, punctuation and spelling that the children have learnt over the course of the academic year.
- The children will be developing their ability to write **expanded noun phrases** such as “the dark, murky pond” and apply it to their independent writing.
- The children will explore conjunctions such as **because and when**.
- The children will be looking into apostrophes for possession (Stanley’s feelings)
- Editing and improving their own work as they respond to their targets will be a continued focus.
- Spellings lessons will continue to take place daily with a spelling test each Friday.
- Handwriting is also a key area of development as the children continue to ensure that letters are formed, orientated and placed on the line correctly every time.



The text we will focus on is: Somebody Swallowed Stanley by Sarah Roberts

The outcome will be: to write our own persuasive advert using persuasive language.

How can I help / information for Helping

Encourage your child to **read daily**. This may be an advert in a newspaper, a magazine, their own choice of book from home or their school reading book. Please feel free to comment about your child’s wider reading in the back of their record book.

Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book - can you find a word that means the same as _____?

Ask your child to re-read a sentence to build up fluency

What is the different use of an apostrophe?

An apostrophe can be used to indicate possession such as ‘**the girl’s balloon**’ or ‘**the boy’s new bike**’.

An apostrophe can also be used in a contracted word such as ‘**did not**’ becoming ‘**didn’t**’ to indicate the omission of letters.

Maths

- This half term, the children will be learning about **time**, with practical learning opportunities. The children will learn how to tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. They will also learn how to compare and sequence intervals of time and learn the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day
- To finish the half term, we will begin our unit of work on **volume** where children will be measuring in litres and millilitres and solving word problems associated with volume.
- We will continue to consolidate the children’s knowledge of the four operations (+, -, x and ÷) as well as their understanding of fractions and shape during our maths lessons and morning maths tasks.
- They will continue to solve problems and learn to explain, convince others and justify their findings using mathematical vocabulary: **I know that..., I think.... because....**
- In topic lessons we will learn about **tally charts** and **pictograms** within our Geographical skills and fieldwork unit.



How can I help / information for Helping

Please help your child to learn their times tables and the related division facts; such as, $9 \times 2 = 18$ and $18 \div 2 = 9$, as this increases their mathematical confidence and accuracy in all areas of maths.

Please support your child with telling the time at home using an analogue clock.





Topic	Science	P.E
<p>Focus is: During our topic of Geography skills and fieldwork the children will answer the question “Can I make a difference?”</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will learn the compass points and will conduct traffic surveys and undertake fieldwork studies of the local area. They will also look at aerial photographs of England and recognise famous landmarks</p>  <p>Applied through: History / English /Maths</p>	<p>Focus is: This half term the children will carry out a topic on plants.</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will learn about seeds and bulbs and how they grow into mature plants. We will conduct an investigation to find out what happens to seeds which are grown under different conditions and discuss why some seeds were more successful than others.</p>   <p>Our SITE project will focus on wheels and axles and we will each build a seed spreader which can be pushed or pulled along.</p>	<p>Focus is: Games - outdoors</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: Team games, cooperation and working together.</p> <p>Applied through: Children will develop their techniques to enhance their co-ordination and will play a variety of games in small teams.</p>  <p>Our PE day is Thursday. Please ensure that your child has their named outdoor PE kit including trainers.</p>
<p>How can I help / information for Helping Discuss the area where you live and look at maps to find North, South, East and West. Can they give simple directions from one landmark to another? Can they make a set of directions for a toy to reach a set point using compass points/right and left?</p>	<p>How can I help / information for Helping Engage in conversation about nature around the home or in the local environment. Take a nature walk or visit a local nature reserve. Do you have plants in your garden at home? Do you know the name of some flowers or plants? What do you notice about the flowers and plants?</p>	<p>How can I help / information for Helping Practise throwing and catching with different sized balls. Encourage children to create their own games and rules and explain how by working together, they are more likely to be successful.</p>

<p>Focus is: Inventing a musical story</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: Children will experience a wide range of musical styles which will help them with listening, singing and playing, composing and performing.</p> <p>Applied through: practical sessions and Charanga</p>	<p>Focus is: Keeping Safe indoors and Outdoors</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: Pupils learn about keeping safe in the home, including fire safety. Pupils learn about road safety and can identify hazards and risks.</p> <p>Applied through: Discussion / Circle time / debate</p>	<p>Focus is: How can we look after our planet?</p> <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed: Re-telling religious and non-religious stories and beliefs about creation and thinking about how we can look after our beautiful environment.</p> <p>Applied through: Discussion / Circle time / debate</p>
<p>How can I help / information for Helping Listen to different genres of music. Talk about the different instruments you can hear. What kind of music is it? Classical? Jazz? Pop?</p>	<p>How can I help / information for Helping Discuss risks in and outside at home and talk about how we manage them. Discuss what you would do at home if different situations to keep safe.</p>	<p>How can I help / information for Helping Discuss recycling at home – do you have a recycling bin? Can you encourage your child to sort some items for recycling? A debate is being encouraged at the moment about the use of plastic – can you discuss how to reduce the use of plastic in your home?</p>

<p><u>Ongoing Homework</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading: We encourage all children in KS1 to read for 15 minutes a day. Please log what they have read in their reading record. Books will be given out on Tuesday and Friday each week. They will ONLY be changed on these days and will stay in book bags until these days so please keep reading and re-reading books at home to improve fluency. If children could keep their reading books in their bags each day this would ensure that we can read with them in school during the week too. • KIRF target: See maths • Spellings: A list of spelling words will be sent out each Friday, with a spelling test the following Friday. <u>Please bring your spelling homework sheet back every Friday.</u> • Times Tables: A set of times tables will be sent out each Monday, with a times tables test the following Monday. Remember to also log on regularly onto Times Table Rock stars! <p><u>Maths / English Homework</u> English and Maths homework will be sent out each Thursday, to be returned the following Tuesday.</p> <p>Please encourage your children to discuss their homework at home in order that they develop the skills of explanation and reasoning. Please feel free to annotate or let us know if your child has worried or struggled with their work and we will support them in school with it.</p> <p>Children will be set a Learning Log activity each half term. This will be related to the Enriched Curriculum. On weeks when this is set, it will replace Maths or English homework.
