All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: Can I make a difference?			
English	Maths		
 This half term we will be focusing our guided reading and daily grammar lessons on 'The Fantastic Flying Books of Mr Morris Lessmore' by W.E.Joyce. This focus book is a lovely story linked to our SMSC theme of making a difference by helping others be happy through reading. The moral of the story will hopefully encourage even more reading from the children. The children will explore the use of parenthesis to add detail to their sentences. The children will also explore the use of reported and direct speech which will lead them to write a newspaper report about the day Morris Lessmore discovered books. Children editing and improving their own work as they respond to their targets will be a continued focus. 	 The term will begin with a focus on angles, including identifying, measuring and drawing different angles and angles within a shape. These angles include: acute, right, straight, obtuse and reflex. <i>ight ight include include include include include</i> The children will explore the properties of the shapes and describe how the position of a shape changes following a reflection (creating a mirror image) or translation (movement of a shape). We will complete the term with a focus on measure in order to covert between imperial and metric conversions. The measurements we will look at include: time, length, weight and capacity. They will continue to solve problems and learn to explain, convince others and justify their findings using specific vocabulary: <i>I am certain that, I think because, I know that so must be</i> 		
How can I help? What is parenthesis? Parenthesis is additional information added into a sentence as an explanation or an afterthought; this can be a word, a phrase or a clause. Parentheses can be shown using two brackets, two commas, or two dashes. When a parenthesis is completely removed, the sentence is still grammatically correct. E.g. Mr Morris Lessmore (who likes to help others) brings joy to all through the love of reading. What is direct and indirect speech? Direct speech is when the exact words spoken are reproduced in inverted commas (speech marks). Indirect speech is when the general points of what someone has said are reported, without the use of speech marks. It is sometimes called reported speech.	 How can I help? Encourage your child to practise their KIRF target at home by asking: What is 8 squared? What is 7 multiplied by itself? What is the square root of 144? Use this interactive game to help familiarise protractor use: https://www.mathplayground.com/measuringangles.html 		

Topic – (Geography)	Science	P.E
Focus is: 'Can I make a difference using maps?' Skills / Knowledge to be developed: We will develop our map skills in order to be able to describe the features of the land, using four and six figure grid references, 8 compass points and OS symbols. The children will learn co-ordinates and be able to use these and compass points to give directions. We will explore: global environmental issues, how to live sustainably and focus on a comparison between the geography of old and new England, maps in Europe and other countries, and more unusual maps such as the London Underground. Applied through: Geography lessons, maths using co-ordinates, map hunts around the school grounds and French directions. Art links: We are learning the knowledge and skill of watercolours, and we will create final landscape pieces inspired by a range of artists.	Focus is: Life cycles of animals, including humans. Skills / knowledge to be developed: Our science work will look closely the life processes of mammals – including humans, amphibians, reptiles, insects and birds. Applied through: During science lessons, we will investigate life cycles whilst identifying the similarities and differences between those of different animal classes. DT links: Our SITE project will build on our knowledge of life cycles of different plants. We will use a range of sewing techniques to produce a felt book with the purpose of teaching younger children about animals.	Focus is: Invasion Games: Tag Rugby & Athletics Skills / knowledge to be developed: We will recap the basics of passing, tagging and scoring before applying them into match situations. In Athletics, we will practise a variety of running, jumping and throwing events. Applied through: Children will build up their tag rugby skills through developing passages of play both when attacking and defending. We will look at team structure and define individual roles within a team in order to be successful. In athletics, we will build into competition; peers will analyse each other's technique and plan to improve in order to achieve personal bests, their techniques to play a variety of games in small teams. PE this half term will take place on a Wednesday morning.
How can I help? Discuss the different uses of maps in everyday life. Using a map, plan and a follow a route. Go for a walk and draw a map of the route taken.
