

Primary P.E. and Sport Premium



The aim of the P.E. Premium funding is to improve the quality and breadth of P.E. and sport provision whilst increasing the participation and enjoyment of all pupils in P.E. and sport; the funding is 'ring-fenced' and can therefore only be spent on achieving these goals. The funding has also been doubled for this academic year; Shadwell Primary has received in total **£18,100.00** for the 2017-2018 academic year. Both Bramham and Shadwell have their own allocation and must therefore use their own funding for their own pupils.

At Bramham and Shadwell Federation we are proud of the continually increasing opportunities we provide all of our pupils; our P.E. team, led by Mr Brotherton, who has the responsibility of developing P.E. and Sport across both schools and we are excited about the future of P.E. and sport within the Federation. The funding helps us to facilitate our goals and the following document details how and why the funding has/will be spent for the 2017-2018 academic year at Shadwell Primary School.
