 The children will use a range of medium to create pictures and models. They will learn all about different types of houses that are built and apply this knowledge to their builds. They will retell traditional stories using role play, puppetry and through small world. The children will be working towards creating a still life picture of daffodils using water colours. These will be showcased in Receptions Class Gallery at the end of term. The children will continue to have singing and music sessions with a specialised teacher each week. 	 The children will discuss seasonal changes with a particular focus on growing. Explore outside for signs of Spring throughout the term. The children will plant and care for green beans, potatoes and sunflower seeds. The children will continue to feed the birds and monitor the changes that may occur in the pond. They will follow a basic cake recipe and compare it to a cake made from oats.
