This was our first meeting since December because of the lockdown. There was some feedback from the Suggestion Boxes that we had made and we discussed these ideas.

A lot of the suggestions were around

playtimes and it was agreed that since we returned to school, there have been some issues with behaviour. School Councillors will remind everyone of the importance of sharing, taking turns and following school rules.

Football may now be played within our class bubbles. We decided that each class should discuss this and should agree on a plan to use playtimes and the playground fairly. This could be having football at lunchtime but not in playtimes or allocating certain days to football. Some children do not want to play football and they need space to use on the playground whilst others are playing a match.

School Councillors will ask their class teachers to help create teams for the football matches so that this is fair and arguments are avoided. It was felt that girls are not always being given opportunities to be goalkeeper and that the ball is not always passed to them. School Councillors will emphasise the importance of this to their classes. Year 3 and Year 5 are not having time on each side of the playground and so Mrs Hall will look at the rotas and talk to Teaching Assistants about this.

School Council would like the playground to be divided in the morning into the two sides for lining up. Mrs Hall asked if they would move the cones in the morning when they arrive and then move them back at playtime. School Council were happy to try to do this.

We will try and meet with our classes during the week commencing 22 March and set up the new football rotas. The following week we will think about introducing our School Council stickers which arrived during lockdown!

At the next meeting we will make posters reminding everyone about playground rules. These will be displayed on the playground to help everyone behave according to school expectations.
