

## **Curriculum Newsletter**

## Bramham Shadwell Federation Class R February- March 2019



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: How did people treat each other in the past? This term Reception will be continuing to learn about different types of transport.

<ul> <li>boats, aeroplanes and trains. They will be using a range of fiction and non-fiction texts to discuss these different types of transport.</li> <li>All children will continue to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually.</li> <li>For World Book Day we will also be looking at the 'The Word Collector' and collecting lots of exciting vocabulary to use in our work.</li> <li>Writing:</li> <li>All children will be writing simple/ complex sentences. They will practise this through news writing, phonics and independent writing challenges.</li> <li>The children will be recording predictions and findings, alongside story and report writing.</li> <li>We will also continue to further develop our story telling skills which will help develop our writing. The children will regularly create a class story that the teacher will scribe in a whole class book. This will encourage story language and a deeper understanding of the elements which are required to make a story: beginning, setting, characters, problem and resolution.</li> <li>All children will participate in handwriting sessions with a focus on accurate letter formation.</li> <li>The texts we will focus on are:</li> <li>All afloat on Noah's boat, Noah's Ark, The Train Ride and Who Am I</li> <li>How can I help / information for helping</li> <li>Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book. Ask questions to check your child's understanding of the book they have read.</li> <li>Practise letter formation in sound books each week. If your child requires extra challenge:</li> </ul>	The focus numbers this term will be numbers 7 to 9. The children will practise to recognise and order numbers to 9 and beyond. They will continue to develop and practise a quick recall of 1 more and 1 less than a given number. The children will be introduced to the part whole model. This will develop their understanding of partitioning a number. The children will be able to say what the parts are and what the whole is e.g. 2 is a part, 3 is a part, 5 is the whole. The children will recognise and describe properties of 3D shapes. The children will also continue to develop their recording skills using mathematical graphics. They will be encouraged to explain what they have done. The children will be encouraged to explain what they have done. Each week circle times are linked to the weekly ethos statement. This half term the focus will be on the <b>SMSC theme:</b> <b>Thinking of others.</b> This term the 'Class R VIP of the Day' system will continue. Each day we will choose two children to be our ' <u>VIPs</u> ' and parents will be informed. The VIPs will wear lanyards and will be in charge of special jobs in class. Special Assembly will continue to take place every Thursday. This assembly is for the <u>'Star of the Week'</u> . If your child has been chosen you will be informed a week before and invited to attend the assembly, where your child will receive a special certificate.	<ul> <li>Focus is: <ul> <li>Games</li> </ul> </li> <li>Skills / knowledge to be developed: <ul> <li>The children will develop their throwing and catching skills.</li> <li>They will learn to bounce a ball.</li> <li>The children will learn to play small sided games using a ball.</li> <li>They will develop the ability to control a ball in a range of ways.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Exciting fine motor activities will be provided within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control.</li> <li>PE will be on a <u>Tuesday</u> this half term.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Focus is: Transport</li> <li>The children will use a range of mediums to create pictures and models.</li> <li>They will design, build and construct on a large and small scale.</li> <li>The children will also be using paint, oil pastels, chalk and drawing pencils to create observational drawings of daffodils and catkins in response to the changing environment as Spring approaches.</li> <li>The children continue to have singing and music sessions with a specialised teacher on a Friday.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Focus is: Spring</li> <li>The children will observe signs of Spring.</li> <li>They will discuss seasonal changes with a particular focus on growing.</li> <li>The children will learn about the Easter story and they will take part in an Easter workshop at the local Church.</li> <li>The children will also visit the church to explore a Christian place of worship. They will have the chance to use technology to photograph things in the church that interest them.</li> <li>The children will also visit the National Railway Museum on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March to look at old and new trains. The children will compare the differences and similarities between the trains, as well as watching a Punch and Judy show and going on a miniature train ride.</li> </ul>
