Class 1 April - May 2021



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question: Can I make a difference?			
English	Maths		
<ul> <li>This half term we will be reading "Jack and the Beanstalk" and other fairy stories linked to our science topic of plants.</li> <li>We will continue to focus on punctuation, in particular full stops and exclamation marks. We will also pay close attention to conjunctions and using the prefix –un and the suffixes –ing, -ed and –s/es. The children have been making sure they use the success criteria to write 'super sentences'. See the example below. This helps them check their own work.</li> <li>My sentences must have: A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A a b A A A A</li></ul>	<ul> <li>The children will be developing their understanding of multiplication by counting in equal groups, using apparatus to support their calculations. The children will then apply this knowledge as they move on to division where they will learn to share objects and numbers into equal groups.</li> <li>We will then be moving on to telling the time, learning about o'clock and half past.</li> <li>They will continue to explore the term 'equal' by finding fractions of shapes and numbers to 20. The children will be learning about 'halves' and 'quarters'.</li> <li>We will begin to practise our times tables. The children will be learning the 2, 5 and 10 times tables through daily practice at the beginning of each maths lesson.</li> <li>All children should be able to recall their number bonds to 10. This knowledge can then be applied to solve number problems using greater values.</li> <li>In science lessons we will create a Sunflower Diary to record the growth of the seeds we plant. Each child will make an initial prediction and then measure their plants in different units each week as the flower grows.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>How can I help / information for Helping</li> <li>Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book as well as other books you read together. Can you find a word that means the same as? Can you spot any of your phonics sounds in these words? Ask your child to re-read a sentence to build up fluency.</li> <li>Practice writing together in a range of contexts e.g. silly stories, shopping lists, letters to friends and family, postcards etc.</li> <li>Help your child to practise their spellings (these will be sent home every Monday and tested the following Monday). Spot sentences containing their spellings when they read to you and write sentences together containing these words.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>How can I help / information for Helping Allow your child to share out items equally between family members.</li> <li>Practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables – sing them on the way to school, in the car etc Look at both analogue and digital clocks with your child and encourage them to tell the time.</li> <li>Please help your child to revise addition and subtraction facts to 10. E.g. 10=5+5, 10-6=4. Quick recall of these facts will help your child to solve problems with greater numbers also.</li> <li>KIRF Targets – Summer Term 1</li> <li>To tell the time to the nearest hour.</li> <li>To tell the time to the nearest hour.</li> <li>To tell the time to the nearest half hour.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Focus is: Maps and our local environment.</li> <li>Skills / knowledge to be developed: The children will be using locational language to describe the features on a map. They will also use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of the school and its grounds.</li> <li>Applied through:</li> </ul>	Focus is: This half term our science topic will be 'Growing'. The children will look at the signs of Spring and learn how plants grow. Skills / knowledge to be developed: Class One will learn about the different parts of a plant and their functions, the life cycle of a plant and what a plant needs to grow. Locate seaside towns and discuss how they are 'coastal' and Leeds is 'inland'. Talk about the features of a map. Discuss north, south, east and west – which direction does their bedroom window face? You could go on a Spring walk and name as many plants and trees as you can see. You could plant food and flowers at home and watch their growth.
