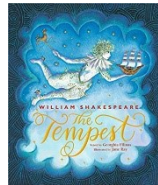


All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:

**How did people in the past aim to lead better lives?**

## English

- During this half term, Year 6 will explore **William Shakespeare's 'The Tempest'**. Throughout this unit of learning, children will have opportunities to demonstrate understanding of the play through:
  - **Speaking and Listening** opportunities such as **acting out the plot and debate**.
  - Applying their **reading skills** through text immersion activities.
  - Composing multiple pieces of writing such as **non-chronological reports, newspaper articles and character analysis**.
- Children will also spend time polishing their **handwriting**, this will give them an opportunity to practise writing with a pen before going to high school.



**The texts we will focus on are:** The Tempest

**The outcome will be:** Completion of a range of pieces linked to 'The Tempest' showcasing all of their KS2 learning.

### How can I help / information for helping:

Encourage daily writing in a pen with correct formation and joining.

## Maths

- The children will continue to do some **problem solving** this half term to further develop their resilience and perseverance before high school.
- We will work on **logic and reasoning problems** and continue to apply maths skills in a range of problems; using maths in **real-life, practical situations**.
- There will be some **cross-curricular** lessons linked to our English focus 'The Tempest' based on planning the journey in the play that will give children the opportunity to **exemplify their ability to reason and think mathematically**.
- Mathematical **fluency** is crucial to mathematical success. In preparation for high school, please work with your child to ensure they have a secure knowledge of the facts from the whole of Upper KS2 outlined in the **KIRF target** below.
- We will continue with weekly times table tests


### KIRF Target – Summer Term

- I know decimal number bonds to 1 and 10
- I know the multiplication and division facts for all times tables up to  $12 \times 12$
- I can identify prime numbers up to 20.
- I can recall metric conversions
- I can recall square numbers up to  $12^2$  and their square roots.
- I can find factor pairs of a number
- I can identify common factors of a pair of numbers
- I can convert between decimals, fractions and percentages.
- I can identify prime, and composite numbers up to 50

Topic – History	SITE	P.E
<p><b>Focus is:</b> The Industrial Revolution</p> <p><b>Skills / Knowledge to be developed:</b> We will use the <b>industrial revolution</b> to explore the development and changes within British society, in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century. We will look at the <b>impact it had on people’s lives</b> and <b>how it advanced science and engineering</b>. This will support class 6 in developing their understanding of the question ‘<b>How did people in the past aim to lead better lives?</b>’.</p> <p>In addition, we will use this opportunity to revisit and recover some objectives linked to <b>local history</b> that children missed during last year’s school closures.</p>	<p><b>Focus is:</b> Life Cycles (<i>Year 5 Recovery Topic</i>) and KS2 Science Revision</p> <p><b>Skills / knowledge to be developed:</b></p> <p>Class 6 will be revisiting some of the learning linked to <b>life cycles</b> that they would have had as home learning opportunities last Summer. We will use this as an opportunity to <b>consolidate our learning</b> and <b>explore our understanding further</b> as a class.</p> <p>We will end the year with some quizzes and activities to conclude our KS2 science learning.</p>	<p><b>Focus is:</b> Striking and Fielding</p> <p><b>Skills/knowledge to be developed:</b> Children will be practising their <b>throwing, catching, striking</b> and <b>fielding</b> as well as developing team-work and tactical knowledge</p> <p><b>Applied through:</b> Striking and fielding focused games such as <b>rounders</b>.</p> <p>Children will be participating in <b>Bikeability</b> training from the 14<sup>th</sup> June. This three-day course will ensure children are confident in cycling techniques for riding safely on the road.</p> 
<p><b>How can I help / information for Helping</b> Research and explore the impact of the industrial revolution within our local towns and cities.</p> <p>Plan a visit to Leeds Industrial Museum.</p>	<p><b>How can I help / information for Helping</b> Children to continue their wildlife documentary skills from previous projects to include understanding of the life cycle of an animal of their choice.</p>	<p><b>How can I help / information for Helping</b> Children should have outdoor kit, a <b>drinks bottle</b> and suitable sun protection including a <b>hat</b> and <b>sun cream</b>. Please ensure all children have their full PE kit in school <b>every day</b> as sessions may change.</p>

Art	Music	PSHE / MindMate	R.E.
<p><b>Focus is:</b> Expressing Emotions</p> <p>Children will be continuing with their <b>expressing emotions</b> project from our previous half term. They will move on to learning how to distort their self-portraits to create them in the German expressionist style we have been studying.</p> <p>We will also have an <b>Art Day</b> on the <b>23<sup>rd</sup> of June</b> where we will focus on recovering areas that might have been lost during school closures.</p>	<p><b>Focus is:</b> Rhythm and Body Percussion</p> <p>It is Year 6’s turn to have some <b>specialist music lessons</b> with our music teacher Ms. Crowley. They will be having weekly sessions that will be carried out online. During these sessions, children will explore their <b>understanding of rhythm</b> through <b>creating beats</b> using their bodies.</p>	<p>‘<b>Changes</b>’ is our theme for this final half term, where we will consider our feelings about <b>moving on to High School</b>. We will be looking at what will stay the same and what may change and the benefits and challenges that will come with this new experience.</p> <p>We will also continue the <b>Sex and Relationship Education</b> lessons, which will support the children’s understanding of the physical and emotional experiences they will have over the next few years. There will be an <b>information session</b> on the topics and learning that we will cover on <b>Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> June</b> at <b>4pm via Zoom</b> for parents who would like to know more about these lessons.</p>	<p><b>Focus is:</b> What matters most to believers? (<i>Year 5 Recovery Topic</i>)</p> <p>Children will explore the <b>concept of values</b> and what values matter to them as well as develop an understanding of the <b>core values and principles in other religions</b>.</p>

<p><b>How can I help / information for helping</b></p> <p>Discussion of emotions through final term of primary school. Practise (even more) portrait drawing using a Youtube video for guidance. Be open to questions and discussion following the SRE lessons; we encourage the children to tell you what they have discussed.</p>	<p><b>How can I help / information for helping</b></p> <p>Discussion of different values in different contexts such as family values, friendship values and professional/educational values.</p>
