

Class target - Year 2 – Autumn 2



I know doubles and halves of numbers to 20.

By the end of this term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for ALL children to be able to recall these facts **instantly**.

0 + 0 = 0	$\frac{1}{2}$ of $0 = 0$	11 + 11 = 22
1 + 1 = 2	½ of 2 = 1	12 + 12 = 24
2 + 2 = 4	½ of 4 = 2	13 + 13 = 26
3 + 3 = 6	1⁄2 of 6 = 3	14 + 14 = 28
4 + 4 = 8	½ of 8 = 4	15 + 15 = 30
5 + 5 = 10	½ of 10 = 5	16 + 16 = 32
6 + 6 = 12	½ of 12 = 6	17 + 17 = 34
7 + 7 = 14	½ of 14 = 7	18 + 18 = 36
8 + 8 = 16	1⁄2 of 16 = 8	19 + 19 = 38
9 + 9 = 18	1⁄2 of 18 = 9	20 + 20 = 40
10 + 10 = 20	1⁄2 of 20 = 10

Top Tips
