Class R February- March 2022



This term the children will be learning all about Traditional Stories.

Communication, Language and Literacy

- We will be focusing on traditional stories: 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and 'The Three Little Pigs'.
- The children will listen to alternate versions of the stories and have lots of time to discuss and compare stories.
- They will be retelling stories through story maps, speech bubbles and story writing.
- We will focus on the 4 Success Criteria: To say our sentence out loud, capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- All children will continue to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually.
- We will also be further developing our story telling skills which will help develop our writing. The children will create a class story that the teacher will scribe in a whole class book. This will encourage story language and a deeper understanding of the elements which are required to make a story: beginning, setting, characters, problem and resolution.

The texts we will focus on are:

Three Billy Goats Gruff, The Three Little Pigs,

How can I help / information for helping

Share a variety of books at home with your child.

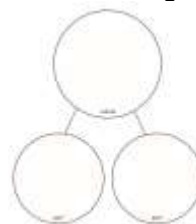
Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book. Ask questions to check your child's understanding of the book they have read.

Practise accurate letter formation

When your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.

Mathematical Development

- The focus will be on numbers 7 and 8.
- The children will explore number bonds to 8 using their subitising skills.
- They will continue to develop their quick recall of 1 more and 1 less than a given number.
- The children will continue to use the part part whole model and the ten frames to explore number bonds up to 8. This will help develop their understanding of partitioning.



The children will be able to say what the parts are and what the whole is e.g. 2 is a part, 3 is a part, 5 is the whole.

- The children will recognise and describe properties of 3D shapes.
- The children will also continue to develop their recording skills using mathematical graphics. They will be encouraged to explain what they have done.

How can I help / information for Helping

Practise saying 1 more and 1 less than a given number to 10 and beyond.

3D shape hunt. Can they name them and describe their properties?

Accurate number formation of numbers to 10.

Encourage your child to identify coins and to help pay for items when out and about.

<p>Focus is: Consolidating knowledge of Set 2 and 3 sounds:</p> <p>Ch, sh, th, qu, ay, ee, ow, igh, oo, oo, ar, or, ir, air, ou and oy.</p> <p>The children will also be continuing to practise blending and segmenting skills in order to read and write words.</p> <p>The children will apply their phonic skills when writing two-syllable words (carpark), captions and short sentences.</p> <p>Tricky words: The children will continue to learn red tricky words: the, you, your, said, what, want, do, I, no, so, go, old, her, of, what, want, they, to, he, me, we, she</p> <p>Children will also be learning to read the next set of tricky words: we, my, by, do, does, old, all, tall, call</p>	<p>This term the children will listen to a range of Social Stories to help support emotional resilience and problem solving.</p> <p>Twice a week children will join their Key Worker for chatty time/ circle time before going to the carpet for phonics. This is a great chance for children to discuss and share their emotions and feelings</p> <p>This term the 'Class R VIP of the Day' system will continue. Each day we will choose two children to be our 'VIPs' and parents will be informed. They will be in charge of special jobs in class.</p> <p>Special Assembly will continue to take place every Friday.</p>	<p>Focus is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gymnastics <p>Skills / knowledge to be developed:</p> <p>The children will continue to work on creating shapes using their bodies. They will be moving safely on and around the apparatus. The children will learn to perform: tuck, straddle and pike positions on the apparatus. The children will incorporate these movements into a small routine.</p> <p>Exciting fine motor activities will be provided within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil control.</p> <p>PE will be on a Wednesday this half term.</p>

<p>Focus is: Traditional Stories and Still life art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will use a range of medium to create pictures and models.# They will learn all about how houses are built and apply this knowledge to their builds. They will retell traditional stories using role play, puppetry and through small world. The children will be working towards creating a still life picture of daffodils using water colours. These will be showcased in Receptions Class Gallery at the end of term. <p>The children will continue to have singing and music sessions with a specialised</p>	<p>Focus is: Seasonal Changes and Growing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children will discuss seasonal changes with a particular focus on growing. Explore outside for signs of Spring throughout the term. The children will plant and care for green beans, potatoes and sunflower seeds. The children will continue to feed the birds and monitor the changes that may occur in the pond. They will continue to follow the recipe to make play-dough each week with the aim that they will be able to make play-dough independently by the end of the academic year.

Please continue to add WOW moments where your child achieves something new or may have experienced something new, so that we can celebrate them in class.
