We are already considering ways to enable you to have more information about the academic start your child has had at this early point in the year and to start to trial this in our next parent consultation meetings.
The half-termly class curriculum newsletters provide me with too much detail, not enough detail, about the right amount of detail.	84% felt it was about the right amount.	With such a positive response, we decided not to make many changes. You may have noticed that the most recent curriculum newsletters contain a similar amount of information. We have created a refreshed format (which we hope is more visually pleasing) and have ensured that we provide the information on two pages to make it easier to refer to.
The recent 'open door 'visit the classroom event should be held again next school year	73%	There was a more mixed response to this new part of our offer to parents. Overall, it was good to see that the majority of respondents felt it should continue. 16 % were unsure. We have decided to continue with this next Autumn, but a little earlier in term in response to feedback given on the day that this would be preferred. We will continue to review this part of our approach to welcoming parents into school over the coming years.
I have read the new format monthly digital school newsletter (issued at the start of October) which contained diary dates, news and celebration information.	86% replied 'yes'	We are so pleased that so many respondents have read the newsletter in its new format. The format continues to evolve with the inclusion of film/sound clips to bring school activities to life. We are happy to hear any ideas families may have for suggested types of content in our newsletter – do feel free to chat to Mrs Ellis or email the office.
My child does well at this school.	88%	We are pleased that the majority of respondents felt this to be the case. 'Doing well' covers all aspects of school life so we need to look at which area some families perceive to be weaker for their child. This is an area we will continue to investigate. If you have any worries about your child, please do make an appointment to meet or call your child's teacher in the first instance so we can work together to resolve these.
The school is increasing the opportunities for me to come in and visit.	85%	We are pleased to be able to increase the opportunities for families to come into school. Whether it be through the new 'open door' or 'work gallery' events, or by holding FOSS fairs in school, it is a pleasure to welcome you in. We will continue to look for further ways to develop this.
