Expressive Art and Design

Children will be encouraged to:

- Create art pieces from around the World (Aboriginal art, Koru and Ndebele art)
- Join in new songs and rhymes
- Use instruments to accompany songs
- Listen to music from around the world
- Draw and watercolour landmarks in London
- Make models of buildings using reclaimed materials

Mathematical Development

Children will be encouraged to:

- Count to 20 and beyond and recognise patterns
- Explore odds and evens and double facts
- Consolidate recall of number bonds to 5
- Recall some number bonds to 10
- Compare quantities using greater than, less than
- Explore and manipulate shapes
- Begin to explore sharing and grouping
- Explore mapping

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will be encouraged to:

- Reinforce Golden Rules
- Discuss their own experiences in and out of school
- Talk about their homes and places that are important to them
- Jigsaw Jenie Work
- Learn about different cultures around the world
- Learn about Swindon and Great Britain

Understanding the World

Children will be encouraged to:

- Use a variety of sources to increase their knowledge of the world around them
- Find out about different cultures and ask questions about other cultures
- Learn about the climate and weather in different countries
- Look at different ways of travelling
- Learn about Swindon and the towns landmarks
- Learn about different types of homes
- Produce maps of the local area
- Find out about famous landmarks around London
- Explore what animals come from different countries

Physical Development

Children will be encouraged to:

- Develop fine motor skills
- Develop gross motor skills
- Prepare for Sports Day races
- Play team games
- Develop and embed letter formations

Communication, Language and

Literacy

Children will be encouraged to:

- Listen to a wide range of stories from around the world and to become familiar with the language of books- author, illustrator, cover, writing etc
- Retell stories using Pie Corbett making story maps and then writing stories
- Role play activities retelling stories using props, puppets
- Use information books to find out about different countries
- Write about their favourite places.
- Write simple sentences using their phonic knowledge about fruits and animals
- Continue with phonics daily
