

# Who's afraid of the...?

## Communication, Language and Literacy

Children will be encouraged to:

- Listen to a wide range of stories and to become familiar with the language of books- author, illustrator, cover, writing
- Role play activities retelling stories using props, puppets, story sacks.
- Join in mark making and writing activities
- Begin to learn phonemes following the Supersonic phonic friends programme
- They will talk about characters in the books and develop their use of "book language" like author, front page, words, and pages.
- The children will begin to discuss the characters' feelings in a range of books and describe the setting in which the stories take place.
- Extend their vocabulary, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words
- Retell narratives in the correct sequence, drawing on language patterns of stories.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will be encouraged to:

- Work together, to share resources, to develop positive relationships with adults and other children.
- Discussing feelings - transition from pre-school.
- Through large and small group discussions we will be encouraging the children to discuss their own thoughts and ideas and to value the opinions of others.
- We will be reinforcing "Our Golden Rules" and encouraging positive behaviour.
- We will be encouraging them to be independent- zip up their own coats, put away their own belongings.
- Discuss their own experiences both in and out of school.
- Jigsaw work/ Circle time - Celebrating differences.
- Form good relationships with adults and peers.
- Think carefully about how we can stay safe on Firework night.
