## Application for absence in term time.

Parents do not have the right to take their children out of school for holidays in term time. By law you must ask permission for your child to miss school. Swindon Borough Council and the DFE advise parents not to disadvantage their child's education by taking holidays in term time. Parents can request a term time absence however it is at the discretion of the head Teacher as to whether it is approved or not, based on the current attendance pattern of the child, nature and purpose of the trip, whether statutory tests will be missed, duration etc. If the absence is not authorised you risk a £60 penalty notice. This is levied per parent, per child and if not paid within 28 days increases to £120.

To ensure time off school is treated as an authorised absence and not an unauthorised absence the following request form must be completed and agreed by the Head Teacher. All applications will be replied to in writing within 5 days of receipt.

Unauthorised absence is deemed as truancy even if sanctioned by the parent.

The government now deem any child with attendance below 85% to be persistently absent.

To give you some perspective about what attendance levels mean and the possible results and consequences of poor attendance please see the table below. A child with 90% attendance is missing the equivalent of half a day per week or half a year of schooling in 5 years of primary education.
