Monday

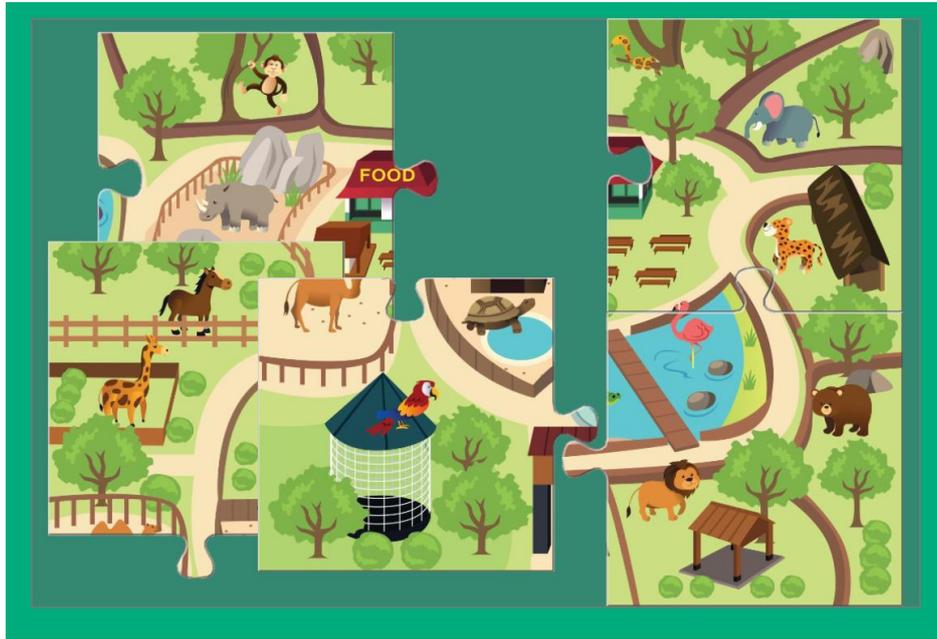
Welcome to start of a new week! This week, we are going to be doing some activities all about the zoo! Have you ever been to the zoo? What animal would you like to see most at the zoo?



What did you see at the zoo?



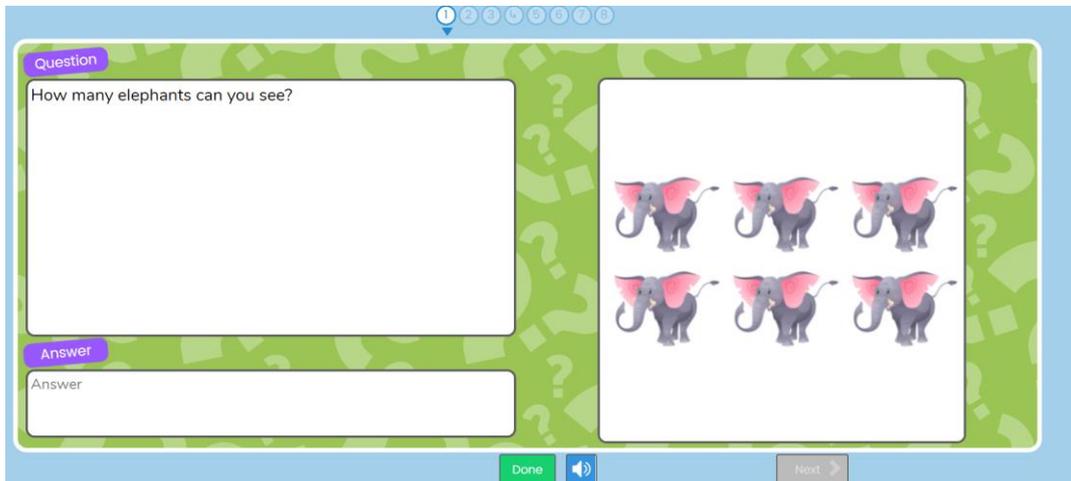
After that, have a go at the jigsaw of a zoo map. What can you see on the map? Where would you visit first?



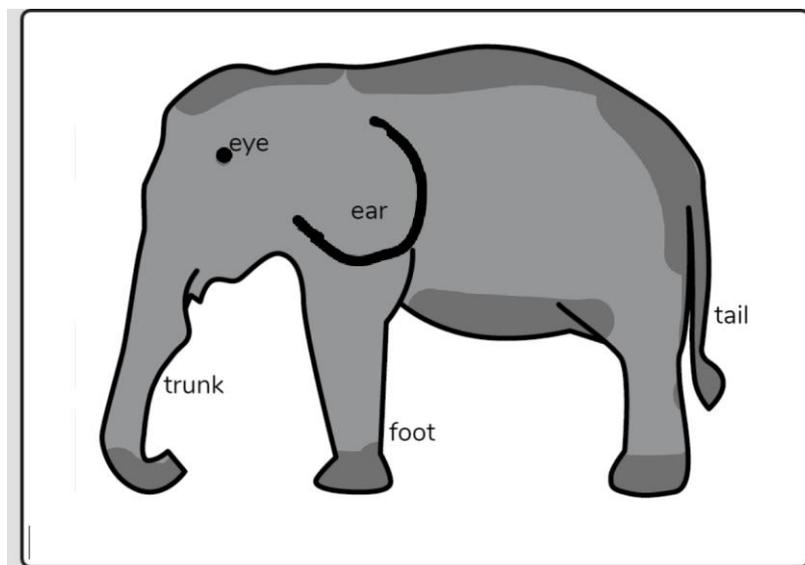
Well done, make sure you eat a nice healthy snack today!

**Thursday**

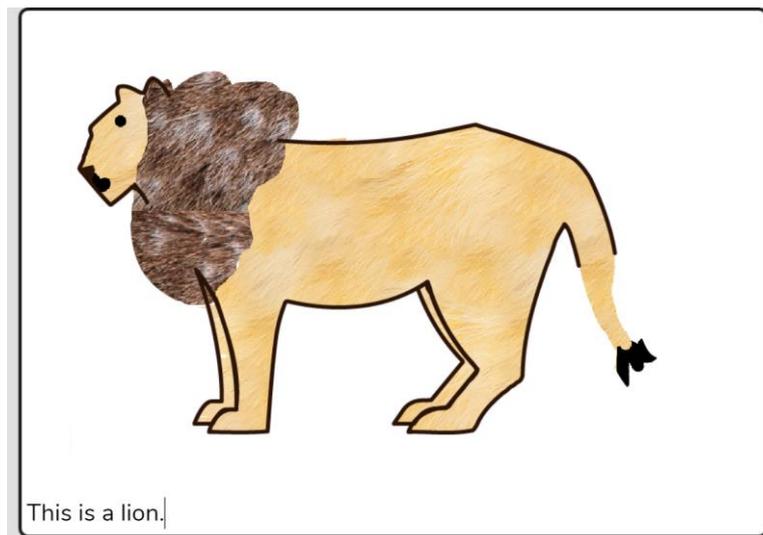
Today we are going to begin with a missing sound activity. Sound out the words and drag in the missing initial sound.

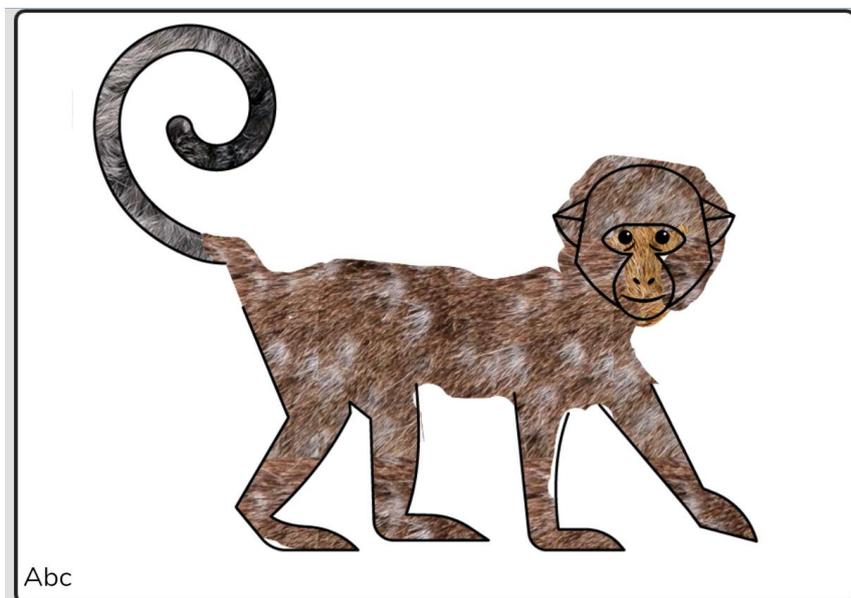
