




# Aged 5 - 7 WEEKLY INSTRUCTIONS WFFK 17


After you have read the first chapter, there are some activities to check your understanding of the story. There are then some fun activities that are linked to what you have read. First of all, there is a jigsaw of a picture from the story, then there is a paint project where you can colour a picture of Anna and Mia.







In maths today, you can practise your 2, 5 and 10 x tables using the 2simple table toons. Can you recall your times tables off by heart?

Try to get outside for some exercise today!




### **Tuesday**




After completing the understanding and word activities, there is a pairs game of the story so far and a paint project of a scene from the story, Jack and the Beanstalk.






In maths today, you have a quiz where you need to find the number that is missing from the number line.

Well done! Make sure you eat some healthy foods today.




# Wednesday




After completing the understanding and missing word activities, you can put the numbered leaves in the correct order and then help Mrs Clark to paint a backdrop for the play.





In maths today, you have a 2race game to complete, where you can practise your subtraction skills within 20.



Well done for your hard work so far this week!




# **Thursday**

In today's chapter of our story, it is the day of the play and everyone is feeling very nervous! Will the show go as planned?



In maths today, you have a quiz to complete with some addition and subtraction word problems.






In your topic work, you are going to begin by designing your own circus! Use the pictures and the clip art to create your own circus picture and write about what is happening.

Great work today, well done!





# **Friday**

Today we read the final chapter of our story 'Anna and the Third Leaf', where Anna becomes the star of the show for a different reason! What do you think she did?




Remember to complete the activities that show how well you have understood this week's story. You then have a sequence the story task to do and a final paint project.
