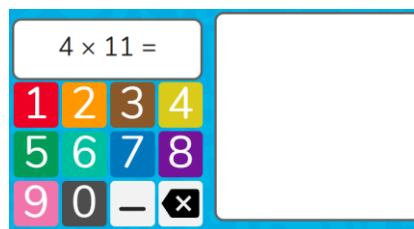

Monday

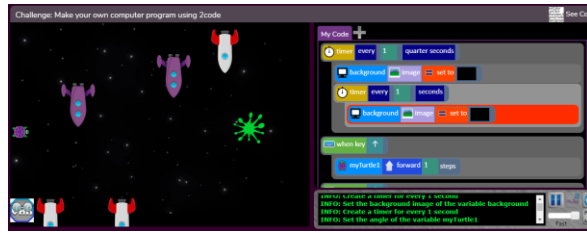
Welcome to the start of the week. Everyone at Purple Mash hopes you had a good weekend and stayed safe. This week we read a new story called '*Planet Earth?*' Stuart gets home and finds someone totally different in his house. When he gets to the bottom of the mystery things are way, way stranger than he ever imagined. In this opening chapter, it's a normal school day but not a normal return home for Stuart as he finds out that things are not quite as he was expecting them. After reading the opening chapter of the story, there is a comprehension activity to show how much of the chapter you have understood. For the extended writing activity, in this chapter, Stuart cannot find his parents. Think about how he must have felt when he realised that everyone in and around his house was a complete stranger. Write about a time when you were lost.



In maths, you will recall multiplication facts for multiplication tables up to 12.



For our coding this week, we have finished all the challenges so it is time to let your creative juices flow. Use 2Code to design a game and then share it with your teacher. An example game has been included for you.



Remember to set some time aside for PE to ensure you keep fit. This could be a run around the garden, a brisk walk with your mum or dad or watching a keep fit routine on the Internet.

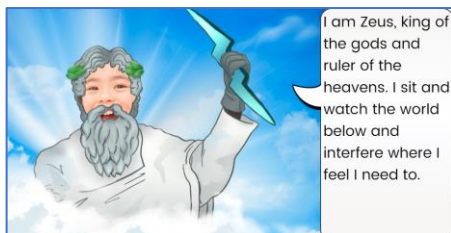


In maths, you are going to sort mixed numbers and improper fractions from smallest to largest.

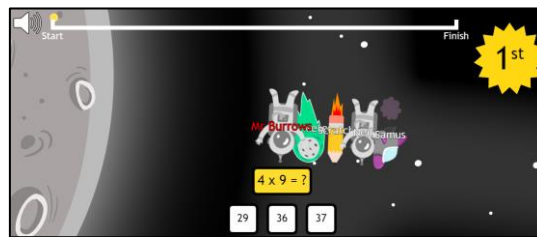

Wednesday

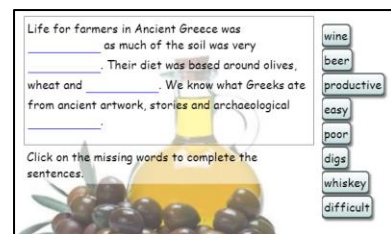
Today we are halfway through the week and you are working well. In Literacy, we are going to read the next chapter of our short story, *Planet Earth?* In today's chapter, inside the building, the children find a strange slogan and a series of satellite images but before long they run into trouble. After completing the comprehension, it is time for some extended writing. In this chapter the children see a sign that suggests there may be more than one world. Maybe the plan is to create a perfect world. Write a description of a perfect world. Think about the problems faced in the world today and what could be done to make it better.



In maths, you race against the computer in 2Race as you answer mentally solve 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Remember the quicker you answer the questions and the more you get correct the quicker the racer will move.



For our topic work on ancient Greece, we are looking at ancient Greek food. There are two activities to complete. Firstly, select the correct word to complete the sentences and then sort the food out into food that would have been eaten by the ancient Greeks and food which would not have been.



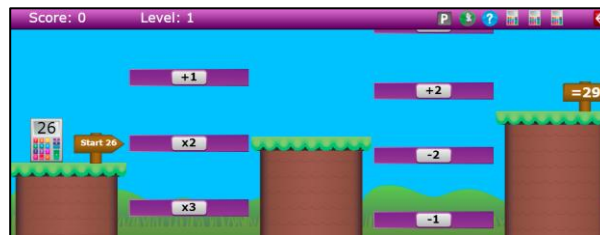
As on previous days, remember to set some time to make sure you move and eat a healthy lunch.

Think about what the children will say to explain their situation and save themselves from being attacked.
