

After reading the story, there is a comprehension exercise to complete and for the extended writing, create an annotated diagram to describe Mickey




In maths, you will complete a quiz about long multiplication. Can you use a written method to find the correct answer?





Wednesday




As on previous days, remember to set some time to make sure you and eat a healthy lunch and time to exercise.

Thursday



Scotland Yard are on his tail, determined to stop what he has planned. After reading the chapter and answering the comprehension questions, for the extended writing, Neville Court was released from prison. Imagine what it would be like to feel free again. Write about how you would spend your first day of freedom after being held captive.



In maths, you are going to carry out some mental mathematical calculations. Remember – no calculator allowed!




For our work on the ancient Egypt, we are looking at the beliefs of the people of the time. There are two activities to complete. For the first activity, there is a developing tray exercise where you need to fill in the missing letters to name the gods or goddesses. Secondly, there is a writing frame about Egyptian deities.

Friday


Today we begin to read the next chapter of our short story. In the chapter, Neville and Jade hack into Neville's computer as they try to find out what he is planning. Will they find the clues? After completing the comprehension activity for the extended writing, at the end of the chapter, just before going off to sleep, Jade realises what Neville Court might be up to. Imagine you are Jade, grab a piece of paper and write down your theory just in case it gets forgotten by the morning.



In maths, you are going to grow your monster with Monster Multiplication. Remember the more accurately and quicker you answer the questions, then the faster your monster will grow.
