

<u>The Good Old Days</u> <u>Year Two Spring Term 2023</u>

Areas of Learning

<u>Year Two</u>

<u>As SCIENTISTS</u> we will be looking at how different materials are used in everyday life. We will also be learning about famous Scientists and inventors.

<u>AS TECHNOLOGISTS</u> we will design and make pop up cards and their functions. We will use cutting and sticking skills to make our products in technology. We will also be exploring how to make Victorian style toys.

In <u>PSHCE</u> we will learning about the importance of hygiene, how to look after our teeth, keeping safe with medicines and the importance of exercise and keeping healthy.

<u>AS HISTORIANS</u> We are going to be learning about the life of Queen Victoria and events that happened during her reign. We will compare different Victorian toys to toys of today using rich and poor as a comparison. We will then use our knowledge learnt to invent our own toys.

As well as learning about Queen Victoria, we will learn about significant people and events outside of living memory.

<u>AS ARTISTS</u> we will look at the work of William Morris and explore patterns. We will study the technique of using repeating patterns. As a group we will explore ideas, collect information and materials to develop our ideas.

<u>As ATHLETES</u> we will be learning how to take part in simple racket sports and we will also develop our core strength to improve physical fitness.

<u>In R.E</u> we will be learning about the Jewish faith and how important Easter is to Christians. MATHEMATICS

We will be following the year two 2014 curriculum for Mathematics. The emphasis will be on: Problem solving when using numbers and how to use calculations in everyday situations. We will practise mental arithmetic every day.

<u>As GEOGRAPHERS</u> we will use simple compass directions and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map.

<u>In COMPUTING</u> we will research a topic linked with 'The Good Old Days' topic and research a significant person from that era. We will also be learning the importance of keeping safe when using the internet.

<u>AS MUSICIANS</u> we will be learning different nursery rhymes and responding to the different moods and expressing our likes and dislikes. We will use the percussion instruments to create a rhythm to the beat of our rhyme.

COMMUNICATION: READING, WRITING, SPEAKING AND LISTENING

We will be following the 2014 curriculum for English. We will read a variety of books and talk about what we have read. We will develop our writing skills through our topic on The Good Old Days. We will develop our speaking and listening, reading and writing skills through Market place activities, quick on the draw, DIAL activities and debates in PSHE. OUR SCHOOL DRIVERS

The key elements of our school drivers are that we will become independent learners who understand the strategies we need to use in order to be independent thinkers and reflective learners. <u>As CREATIVE THINKERS</u> we will ask and answer questions about issues which arise in Circle Time (PSHE). We will reflect on the way we learn the best.

At all times throughout the year we will consider our rights as children and raise issues that concern us through our school council.
