Areas of Learning

<u>Year Two</u>

<u>As SCIENTISTS</u> we will be looking at living things and their habitats and plants.

<u>AS TECHNOLOGISTS</u> We will design and make treasure chests, pirate bandanas and make our own sandwich. We will also complete lots of different challenges throughout the term.

<u>PSHCE</u> we will be looking at people around us and their families. We will also be learning about how to deal with different scenarios which may occur. <u>AS HISTORIANS</u> We are going to be learning about famous pirates and their lives.

As MUSICIANS We will learn about musical elements specifically dynamics and tempo. We will listen to different genres of music from around the world and compare them. We will use percussion instruments to compose our own piece of music. <u>As ARTISTS</u> we will look at how artists distinguish the foreground, middle and background in pictures. We will be using sea/ocean pictures. We will compare English artists and Caribbean artists. As ATHLETES we will be taking part in a range of different athletic activities involving running, jumping and throwing. We will also focus on the skills required to play tennis and cricket. In R.E we will be learning about sacred books and how we should care for others including the world around us and why this matters.

MATHEMATICS

We will be following the year two 2014 curriculum for Mathematics. The emphasis will be on: Problem solving when using numbers and how to use calculations in everyday situations. We will practise mental arithmetic every day.

<u>In COMPUTING</u> we will be learning how to remain safe when using the internet along with programming and following simple algorithms. <u>COMMUNICATION: READING, WRITING,</u> <u>SPEAKING AND LISTENING</u>

We will be following the 2014 curriculum for English. We will read a variety of books and talk about what we have read. We will develop our writing skills through our topic Land Ahoy. We will develop our speaking and listening, reading and writing skills through Market place activities, quick on the draw and VIPER activities.

In GEOGRAPHY

Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and compare it to another country. We will also look at the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.

OUR SCHOOL DRIVERS
