Year 2 Autumn term 2022

In **MATHEMATICS** we will be following the year two Primary Framework for Mathematics. The emphasis will be on: Place Value, Problem solving, measures, shape and space and number. We will practise mental arithmetic every day.

In **ENGLISH** we will follow the Read Write Inc programme to develop our phonics and reading. We will use The Rainbow Fish book to stimulate writing. Spellings will be sent home on a Monday from the year 2 word list.

PSHCE. In PSHE lessons we will learn about the importance of family, friends and community. We will learn about different emotions and effective communication.

As **DESIGNERS** we will develop our cutting skills by attempting a variety of challenges. We will also make Patchwork Quilts.

As **COMPUTER SCIENTISTS** we will learn how to open and save word documents and how to type.

In **RE** we are going to learn about what Muslims and Jews believe.

As **ARTISTS** we will learn about Kondinsky and Primary and Secondary colours. We will also learn about concentric shapes.

In **P.E.** we will be developing our balance, working on moving in different ways and trying to improve our coordination. We will also be learning the basic skills of how to play Basketball.

As **HISTORIANS** we will investigate different significant events such as The Gunpowder Plot and Remembrance Day.

As **SCIENTISTS** we will learning about the changes in animals and a variety of life cycles.

As **GEOGRAPHERS** we will investigate places in the United Kingdom and focus on the capital cities of the 4 countries which are England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. We will briefly talk about the difference between human and physical features.

As **MUSICIANS** we will be learning to sing colour songs and find the beat in different pieces of music.

They will also develop a keen interest in their environment. Our children will strive for enjoyment of learning and make informed choices.
