

Per Parent, Per Child 5 Consecutive Days of Term Time Leave Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave. example; 3 siblings absent for term e leave, would result in each parent civing 3 seperate fines. 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 weel period. **First Offence** The first time a Penalty notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days. Second Offence Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years) The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Magistrate's fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education.' We hope everyone enjoyed their Eid celebrations but please remember that children are allowed only 1 day PER Eid, any further absence will be
