If you have a child of nursery age that you are hoping to start at our school in September, please ensure you either pick up an application form from the office or email <u>office@shawclough.rochdale.sch.uk</u> and request an application pack.

Please note, places are allocated on a first come first served basis therefore having a sibling attend our school does not guarantee a nursery place.

Similarly having a place in nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception. – deadline for applications was October 2023.

### **ST GEORGES DAY**

Some families will be celebrating St Georges Day on the 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2024 but who is St George and why do people celebrate him?

- Whilst being the patron saint of England -George never ever visited England but is the patron Saint of many countries- (Venice, Genoa, Portugal, Ethiopia, Catalonia and they all have celebrations in his honour. He is also the patron of knights, soldiers, scouts, fencers and archers.
- St Georges Day, although still celebrated by many is no longer a national holiday. The day took less significance when England unified with Scotland in 1707 to create the UK.
- St George wasn't English! He was born in Cappadocia (Turkey), his mother was Palestinian and his father was Greek. He died and is buried in Palestine.
- He wasn't a knight and he didn't slay a dragon

   he was more likely a Roman soldier and the story about him saving a princess and slaying a dragon is a popular legend/myth.
- He was however a Martyr, which means he died for his Christian faith. He was executed for not making a sacrifice to the pagan gods. He was canonised (made a saint) by Pope Gelasius in AD 494. 23<sup>rd</sup> April is possibly the date of his martyrdom.
- The emblem of St George is a white flag with a red cross on it. Unfortunately, these days the emblem is used in a negative way by some people but we should remember that the flag (which also appears on the Garter badge – The Order of the Garter) represents those we honour. Many memorials have been built in England over the years, to honour ALL the



soldiers who fell in WW1 and WW2. A number of these memorials feature the emblem and image of St George.

Do you have any items of clothing, textiles, toys and shoes that you no longer need? The PTA will be having a BAG2SCHOOL collection on 9th May 2024.

Why do we have a BAG2SCHOOL collection? Well, it's an easy way to raise funds for our school. The BAG2SCHOOL Company, will collect all the items from school at no extra charge and pay us a small amount for each kg. So remember the more we collect the bigger the benefit to our school.

### WELLBEING AMBASSADORS



Who are the Wellbeing Ambassadors?

The Wellbeing Ambassadors are a group of children who have volunteered their time to help

prompt the wellbeing of their peers through:

- Helping people on the playground if they are feeling lonely.
- Talking to people.
- Being a good listener and help children find a trusted adult.
- Being a friendly role model.
- Promoting the 5 ways to wellbeing.
- Helping children with ideas for their wellbeing.

This term they will be focusing on promoting wellbeing through 'healthy journeys'. They will be distributing a fun activity sheet to each child in school to help them think about their journey to school and how it impacts their health. Look out for it in your child's book bag.

### **FIRST AID**

Just to reassure all parents, our TAs are all qualified first aiders. They all take an intensive 3 day course and learn everything they need to know about first aid for your children. Many of them do a further 2 day Paediatrics First aid training course also.

If your child is injured they will send a standard letter out to you via Medical Tracker (by the end of the day if not immediately) to notify of any injury that needs more than some TLC and a plaster.

If we are concerned that your child is seriously hurt, we will contact you immediately to collect your child and seek further medical help.

Please note that often the office are asked to call home but will have no knowledge of any injuries or illness as first aiders are busy with other children and the request to call home may come through another teacher, lunchtime supervisor or TA.

We ask that you please be patient until we locate the first aider who has dealt with your child.

### HEADLICE

Every so often there is an outbreak of Head lice in a class. If you find that your child has head lice, please see instructions below:



You can treat head lice without seeing a GP.

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them.

You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

### There's no need to keep your child off school if they

### have head lice.

Wet combing:

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)

• comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair. Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

Alternatively, you can buy over the counter products at the pharmacy and follow the instructions on the back **Please note:** Anyone can get head lice

### **PHONES**

For safeguarding reasons please ensure that you are NOT on your mobile phone when you are in the school reception area.

### **PEDESTRAIN GATES**

We kindly ask that when entering and leaving the site that the pedestrian sate is **NOT pulled or pushed**. Please let the gate close and open automatically. If you encounter any problems, please let the office know.

### PARKING

# Shawclough school kindly request that parents -

- Be mindful of where you choose to park around school.
- Be mindful of our neighbours, local community, gardens and



driveways. **DO NOT** move people bins to park your car.

- Be kind and use kind language to each other around the school.
- Remember our children are always listening.
- Set a good example for your children and others.
- Think of the health benefits of parking a little further away and walking. A bit of rain never hurt anyone – kids love it!
- Please do not drive over and along pavements, this is very dangerous and unnecessary.
- Please hold onto your child when arriving and leaving school, especially on the roadside – there have been complaints of children running into the road unsupervised

<u>WARNING</u>: The residents of The Spinney (small road opposite the school) are now working with a private company to clamp any cars that block the entrance/exit. You have been advised to park away from The Spinney.

If you are clamped, the school have no power or say in removal of said clamp.

### **EARLY START & TEATIME CLUB**

For safeguarding reasons, please may we remind parents and carers that **all** children who are attending Early Start Club, **must** be brought in and signed in by an adult.

Any child dropped off before 8:30am will be placed into Early Start Club *and you will be charged for this.* 

If you are late picking up your child, he/she will be taken to teatime club *and you will be charged for this.* Teachers will only wait by the door for a short while after pick up time.

If you arrive late in the morning (8.40am and doors will be closed) you have to bring your child through the main reception area to be signed in and choose their dinner. Class teachers will close the doors at 8.40 regardless of if the bell has gone.

### **PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS**

If you have a *regular* arrangement for a child to walk home (year 6 only) or be picked up by another parent or someone not on the 'class pickup arrangements' please let the office know. Children will not be released to anyone if school have no prior knowledge of it.

If you change pick up arrangements for a one-off afternoon via phone call, this does not constitute a regular change in arrangements. If pickups are to be done by anyone other than someone on your pick list on a regular basis, please notify the office via email/fill in a form.

Too many parents are assuming that if they pick up someone else child, the other person is automatically allowed to pick up their children. This is only possible if they are on each other's list.



Please give the office plenty of notice if arrangements are to be changed – Thank you.

### COMMUNICATION

Please check your email and text (SCHOOL GATEWAY APP) regularly. We can send out a number of messages during the day to notify you of changes in collections, letters going out, trips, payments, etc.

Please advise the office (in writing) if you have had a change in email addresses or phone numbers.

# PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU HAVE DOWNLOADED THE SCHOOL GATEWAY APP.

### IS YOUR CHILD OFF DUE TO ILLNESS OR AN APPOINTMENT?

If your child is off due to illness **YOU MUST** inform the office first thing in the morning. You can leave a message on the answering system and then call to follow up. Alternatively, you can email or text in. **THIS INCLUDES NURSERY.** 

If your child has an appointment first thing in the morning (made last minute) you **MUST** still inform the office and fill in an appointment slip before or on your return to school. School



, should be informed for all other appointments in advance.

If your child has been **vomiting** or is sent home from school for vomiting please be advised that they should be off for **24 hours** from the last bout of sickness.

f your child has **diarrhoea** or is sent home from school due to having diarrhoea, please be advised that they must be off for **48 hours** from the last bout of diarrhoea.
