Keep it as something to help you aspire to be better</p>	<p>Money Create a tuck shop/super market, create fake money and practise totalling money and giving change.</p> <p>World's tallest person – measurement and difference – how much taller than...you/car/fridge/other objects</p> <p>As it would have been Adventure Week, find out the measurements of different sports grounds (football pitches or Wimbledon courts) and calculate the area and perimeter of them</p>	<p>Pictionary – draw a famous person.</p> <p>Taboo – describe a famous person but without say their name, job or what they are famous for.</p> <p>Charades- mime a famous person without speaking.</p> <p>Place a biscuit on your forehead, get it into your mouth without using your hands.
