### Literacy and Reading


During Literacy this term, children will be learning to:

- \*Form letters accurately using the RWI rhymes
- \*Recognise and write my full name
- \*Learn the initial letters by sound
- \*Play Fred games and blend sounds together to segment words
- \*Listen to increasingly longer stories and talk about what happens



During Maths this term, children will be learning to:

- \*Match and sort objects
- \*Represent numbers within 5
- \*Find one more and one less than numbers within 5.
- \*Compare amounts, size, mass and capacity
- \*Name and describe 2D shapes
- \*Use positional language in everyday conversations e.g. above, below
- \*Use time language in everyday conversation e.g. yesterday, tomorrow, now, next Key Vocabulary: more, less, same, different, bigger/biggest, smaller/smallest, behind, under, on top, below, under, sides, edges, round, straight, flat.

#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

### Understanding the World:

Children will be encouraged to talk about members of their immediate family and community. Children will learn that some places are special to members of their community and recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. Children will compare and contrast and will comment on images of familiar situations and situations that have happened in the past.

Key vocabulary: mother, father, siblings, grandparents, family, community, police officers, jobs (occupations), mosque, church, celebrations, Diwali, Christmas, same, different, past, present (now)

During our R.E sessions, the children will be looking at two topics 'Where do we live and who lives there?' and 'what can we see in our wonderful world?' linking to Harvest. Key vocabulary: home, special, worship, belief, church, mosque 

#### Physical Development

During our P.E sessions, the children will be learning to travel in different ways, thinking about their own spatial awareness. Children will also be developing their gross motor and fine motor skills regularly indoors and outdoors as they are encouraged to move with confidence. Children will also learn how to use a range of tools and equipment safely and effectively.

Key Vocabulary: skip, hop, jump, run, walk, travel, slow, fast, stop, start.
