English and Reading

In English, we will be reading the book A River by Marc Martin. Children will be introduced to this story through discussion of location. We will use the detailed illustrations to look at creating expanded noun phrases, alliterative phrases, using past tense verbs and coordinating conjunctions to describe the journey and the location that the main character experiences. The outcome will be for children to narrate their own version of the story.

Maths

In Maths children will be focusing on multiples of 10 up to 100. We will focus on understanding that one ten is equivalent to ten ones and that multiples can be represented using their names or numerals. Children will focus on place value, using charts and number lines to estimate the position of multiples of 10. The children will be able to understand that adding/subtracting 10 to a number gives the next/previous multiple of 10. We will begin to look at counting in our 2s, 3s, 5s and 10 times tables



PSHE

In PSHE our theme is Being in My World. This theme focuses on children's own rights and responsibilities as well as their role and responsibilities as a member of class. We will recognise when we feel worried and who to ask for help. help make our class a safe and fair place, and work cooperatively.

Grammar

We will focus on:

Use of Suffixes -er & -est in adjectives

Using Subordination (when, if, that, because) and Coordination (or, and, but) in sentences

Use of capital letters, full stops and questions marks to demarcate sentences Use apostrophes to make singular possession in nouns



Year 2 Curriculum Overview- Autumn Term 1







Geography

In geography, we will use maps and atlases to locate the different continents and oceans. The children will identify the four counties of the UK, their capital cities and surrounding seas. We will focus on how to use World maps, atlases and globes and simple compass directions to describe a route. We will look at hot/cold places in relation to the equator and north/south poles. We will identify small similarities/differences in physical/human geography.

Topic- Ocean Adventures

Can you find out some interesting facts about one of your favourite ocean animals?

ART

In art children will be focusing on using different materials to create texture. We will look at how different paint brushes create various results, shapes, textures and patterns. The children will mix paints to create secondary colours and look at adding black/white to make tints/shades in their artwork.

In science, we will explore different animals and their Science habitats. Children will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and have never been alive. We will look at how most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants. We will look at and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats, describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals using the idea of a simple food chain, and look at different sources of food.

How is new life welcomed?

In RE we will learn about how babies are welcomed into families, about initiation rights including infant baptism and agigah ceremonies, and be aware that there are other rituals and ceremonies as well.

PE

The theme for this term is Multi-Skills. We will learn how to move our bodies and recognise that the body changes during exercise. Children will learn how to throw and catch, develop travelling using the fundamentals of movement through jogging, sprinting, jumping, hopping, placing weight on hands, and learn how to balance through use of coordination
