Once again, a huge thank you to parents for your continued support through these unsettling times. As previously communicated, the agreed dates for the teachers' strikes are as follows:


- \Rightarrow Wednesday 1st February

What's been happening in Class?

Droplets:

Class Droplets this half term have learnt all about animals. We enjoyed our visit to Cannon Hall Farm! We have compared farmyard and zoo animals and sorted and classified them into groups. We spoke about different habitats in which animals live. The children identified that polar bears come from a cold country and lions come from a hot country. The children then located some of these countries on a globe, as well as countries with significance. We are now beginning to compare farms in the UK to farms abroad - we can't wait to learn about the similarities and differences.



Brooke:

During DT lessons, Class Brook have designed and created their own buckets to carry water, thinking carefully about which materials to use. During our History lesson, we made some Great Fire of London houses and added paper flames to imagine that they were on fire. We worked in two teams using a modern-day bucket and one of our own buckets to try to put the fires out! We even had our very own bakers to act out the role of Thomas Farriner, the baker from Pudding Lane.

What's been happening in Class?

River

Class River has been learning all about multiplication and division in maths. We have been building on our knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and using counters to see how we can make and add groups. We have been using arrays and working on sharing into groups. We can recognise equal and unequal groups d know how important it is to have equal groups when multiplying and dividing.



Lake:

In RE, Class Lake have been reading bible stories and have been learning about Noah's Ark and thinking about how to live a good life.

> In Science, we have been looking at the human body, naming different bones and also looking at which muscles move our arm.

We learnt about the biceps and triceps and also how muscles contract and relax.

What's been happening in Class?


Sea: This half term in Science, Class Sea have been investigation States of Matter in science. In our last lesson we used fizzy water to see how much the gas in one of these bottles weighed.

For the first half of this half term, Class Sea have been creating their own Haka's in dance. This ended with a performance to the rest of the class of the dance they had created.



Ocean: In year 5 we are using Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract to go deeper into division.
