Whilst we understand that there may be issues between families we please ask that parents behave reasonably and with courtesy whilst on school premises.




Catering

Assessments

Year 2 SATS –

The SATS are undertaken in May and we ideally need all pupils at school so that they can be assessed. We know that many of our children may have worries about the current crisis in Ukraine. The Department for Education suggest that we should discuss this with our children. In our experience children worry more when things are not discussed.

We have focussed with our Year 5 class on the historical and factual history of Russia and the Ukraine. They were amazingly mature in doing this work – we have photographed some of their work for you to see. We have placed the powerpoint that we have used with the oldest

children on the website and so if you wish to use it with your own children please do. We have reassured children that the Ukraine is a long way from us and that they are not in danger.

We are really pleased that we have been able to book a residential trip to Peak Venture, Penistone. This will be 11th - 13th May.

Parent support

Unintentional childhood injury results in over 2 million visits to A&E in the UK – Over half of these injuries occur in the home. On average 62 children under the age of five died as a result of an accident and over 76,000 under the age of 14 are admitted for treatment, of which over 40% are under 5 years of age.

This e-learning course enables parents, carers and practitioners to:

• Identify risks in the home and elsewhere that are the common causes of childhood accidents

• Describe steps you are able to take in order to reduce the risk and prevent childhood accidents

• To be confident in making changes or supporting families to make changes, to keep children safer.

The training takes approximately 30 – 40 minutes to complete. On completion you will receive a certificate.

If you are a parent/carer of a young child/ren or a professional working with/supporting young children, we strongly advise you to complete this training to develop your knowledge on child accident prevention. This will enable you to go on to make a difference in reducing childhood accidents in Kirklees.
