What's been happening in Class?

Droplets:

Class Droplets have enjoyed the topic 'celebrations'. We have looked at Christian weddings and Islamic weddings and compared and contrasted what happens at these events. We have enjoyed designing our own religious wedding dresses using a variety of materials such as lace, sequins, tissue paper and felt.



Brook:

Class Brook have been carrying out lots of STEM challenges this half term. During one challenge the children worked in teams to build the tallest tower that they could from paper and sellotape. They were given the same resources per team to ensure the challenge was fair and were allowed the same amount of time to complete the challenge. The winning team managed to create a tower that was 117cm tall! Excellent team work Class Brook!



What's been happening in Class?

River

Class River has been looking at a WAGOLL (what a good one looks like) for our next big write which will be to write a setting narrative. We worked in pairs to look for examples of conjunctions, adverbs ending in 'ly', similes and alliteration, all of which we have been learning about.



Lake:

Children in class Lake have been investigating different types of rocks. Children tested the permeability, hardness and fizziness of rocks. They also looked closely at their appearance.

Through testing each rock, they could determine whether a rock was igneous, metamorphic or sedimentary.

Sea & Ocean:

Our Year 4 & 5's were visited by Mark Eastwood, a local MP for the Dewsbury area. He came to speak to the children about what he does for his job and how parliament works. The children were also able to ask some very intriguing questions.
