PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT

These outcomes are based on the Pupil Premium children we had at our school in the academic year 2019-2020. The pupil premium grant for 2019-2020 was £37, 215. The numbers of PP children can differ during terms.

*The academic year 2019-2020 was severely disrupted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Summary

Pupil Premium (PP) children performed better than our non-PP children in all areas of English; CVGP, Writing and Reading.

PP children performed better than our non-PP children in Using and Applying Statistics, Number (Mathematics).

PP children were outperformed in Number and Shape, Space and Measure (Mathematics).

Moving forward this means that interventions will be specifically targeted for our PP children in Number and Shape, Space and Measure in Mathematics.

Attendance has improved (83.4%) but for some children still remains an issue. Our safeguarding manager has devised protocols to support parents and carers in getting their children to school.

Plans for 2020-2021

The Shenstone Lodge site has £31,555 Pupil Premium grant, which will be spent on the following:
