We are still waiting for the paintwork to be completed and the drive damage to be addressed.

Message from Head of CAMHS Commissioning, NHS Black Country and West Birmingham Clinical Commissioning Group

Due to changed ways of working and increasing pressures on A&E departments currently, we are asking schools to avoid sending children and young people to A&E in order to access Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS). When there is a need for urgent medical treatment due to overdose or other serious self@harm A&E remains the appropriate choice.

In order to access specialist CAMHS or CAMHS crisis teams schools can call the SPA/duty worker on 0121 612 6620 or email bchft.sandwellspa@nhs.net for advice and consultation, 09:00-17:00 hours or CAMHS crisis team between 17:00-20:00 on 07900226390 or "24/7NUMBER" - 0800 008 6516. Please contact CAMHS directly before signposting a child, young person or family to the A&E department for their mental health needs.

We would also ask that if families are becoming anxious about their child being on a waiting list for mental health support and are wanting to be seen earlier they are asked to phone the 24/7 mental health telephone line in the first instance. This is a free phone number 0800 008 6516.
