KIT

- Appropriate kit as outlined by subject specialists, whilst also meeting the overarching criteria above.

Please wear combinations of..	Please avoid...
Smart trousers, chinos, skirts or dresses to knee or longer lengths.	Shorts, jeans, canvas trousers, jogging pants, leggings, mini skirts, skirts with splits, sun dresses or camisole strap dresses.
Full opaque tights.	Inappropriate, revealing or patterned tights.
Tailored, collared shirts or polo shirts, Blouses, smart tops.	Tank tops, midriff tops, halter tops, tops with bare shoulders, sweatshirts with slogans, hoodies.
Plain, sturdy, leather or polishable shoes.	Dolly shoes, trainers, sandals, converse, flip flops, crocs, cut off Uggs.
Blazers, jackets, jumpers or cardigans.
