



Year 3


What a fantastic month it's been for Year 3! The children have been thoroughly engrossed in our

class book Charlotte's Web, showing great empathy and maturity as they coped with the story's tearful ending. In Science, they've loved testing magnets, exploring which materials are magnetic and in PSHE, our focus has been on learning about our community, and the



important roles people play within it. It's been lovely to see everyone working so hard in class and becoming much more confident and settled in our school routines.

Year 5 have had a brilliant half term. They have all worked incredibly hard and should be very proud of themselves!






