Maths	Complete a new level on times Tables Rockstars or some Maths games on Purple Mash.	Create a poster to show what addition and subtraction means. Think of all the words you can that mean addition and subtraction.	Go on a shape hunt in your house. Make a list and draw all the 2D and 3D shapes you see.	Find three things in your home that you can measure. Use a ruler or measuring tape and record their lengths.	Count in steps of 3, 4 and 5.	
Writing	Write a poem about your favourite person, people or place.	Write a paragraph about your favourite day from the holidays.	Imagine you are a character from a movie, write a diary entry about what has happened in your day.	Choose your favourite place. Write some sentences to describe what is looks like, feels like, smells like etc.	Create your own superhero. Write a few sentences about what they look like and their powers.	
Reading	Read a page of your book in 5 places that you never normally read. Take some photos to share with your teacher of the most peculiar (but safe) place you can read!	Ask a family member what their favourite book is and write a book review.	Make a list of words you do not know in your current reading book. See if you can find out what they mean.	Redesign a book cover of your favourite book.	Choose a character from a story and write words/sentences to describe them.	
Wider Curriculum	Find out 10 facts about the Greeks that you did not know before. Present these in a creative way of your choice.	Draw an outfit you would wear if you were a Greek.	Go on a nature walk around your local area and take photographs of any rocks and materials you find.	Create a picture of an imaginary Greek God. Make sure your poster is eye-catching and full of facts and information. Try to think of a symbol for your God.	Make a Spartan helmet or design a shield.
