Maths	Complete garage in TTRS for 4 days in one week. 	Create 10 arithmetic questions for your grown-ups to answer.	Go on a 2D and 3D shape hunt around your home or garden. For each shape, write what it is and where you found it.	Create your own multiplication colour by number picture.	Create a “how-to” leaflet to teach someone how to add fractions with different denominators.
Writing	Imagine you are a first-year student at Hogwarts, and you've just learned about the magical world for the first time. Write a letter to Professor Dumbledore, sharing your thoughts and feelings about Hogwarts.	Create your own wordsearch about <i>Harry Potter</i> . Collect a blank wordsearch template from your class teacher.	Write a review of a book, movie, game, or activity you have recently enjoyed (or disliked).	Write a poem about your favourite things about summer, such as the weather, activities, or nature.	Design your own magical creature.
Reading	Create a "book trailer" for a book you have recently read. This can be done with a short video, a digital presentation, or even a poster.	Read the first few pages of a book or a short story. Then, predict what you think will happen next. After finishing the story, compare your predictions with the actual plot.	Draw a scene from <i>Skellig</i> .	Recreate a front cover for <i>Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone</i> .	Choose a character from a book you are reading and write a paragraph describing the character's traits. Explain what the character says, does, and how other characters react to them.
