Job Description

Purpose of the Role

To deliver high-quality Jewish Studies teaching that inspires, engages and supports all pupils, while actively promoting and upholding the Jewish ethos and values of the school.

The post holder will work in close partnership with:

- Colleagues across the school, particularly class teachers and support staff
- Relevant organisations and charities, where appropriate
- Parents and carers

Key Responsibilities

Planning and Preparation

- Plan and deliver engaging lessons within the Jewish Studies curriculum, meeting the needs, interests and prior attainment of all pupils
- Work collaboratively with colleagues within and across year groups
- Adapt medium-term planning in response to pupils' progress and needs

Teaching and Learning

- Teach classes, groups or individual pupils, setting appropriate and meaningful learning tasks
- Use a range of teaching strategies to support and challenge all learners

Assessment, Recording and Reporting

- Assess, mark and monitor pupils' work in line with school policies
- Maintain accurate records of pupils' progress and attainment
- Contribute to high-quality written and verbal reports

Behaviour and Relationships

- Promote high standards of behaviour, respect and positive relationships
- Foster pupils' understanding of the school's values and Jewish ethos
- Act as a positive role model for Jewish life
