Our vision is to create a culture that encourages all our children to be active and have positive attitudes towards physical activity and healthy lifestyles. At Sinai we equip the children with the knowledge, physical development, movement skills and body confidence that contributes to their physical, mental and social well-being.

We use the funding to ensure there is an impact against the following objective:

- **To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.**

We expect to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
