About Sinai School

Sinai Jewish Primary School is three-form entry, co-educational voluntary-aided school, admitting 90 children into Reception and up to 60 children into Nursery. It is the largest Jewish primary school in Europe – a big school, with a big heart, offering big opportunities.

The school follows the National Curriculum and strives to embed a lifelong love of learning and boasts a team of dedicated and driven staff who all believe that every child has the right to the best education. We have extensive sports facilities, including a purpose built gym and specialist French, Music, Art and PE teaching. We also have a SEN department and sensory room as well as an on-site school counsellor available to all our children.

Our size means we offer amazing opportunities both inside and outside the classroom whilst we nurture and care for the well-being of every child.

Sinai offers a wealth of extra-curricular activities including dance, drama, karate, Krav Maga, Art, chess, choir and computer classes. We also support the working parent and offer daily breakfast and afterschool clubs as well as school coaches from Radlett, Elstree, Borehamwood and Stanmore and Bushey.

Themed days, workshops, school trips, visits from speakers and theatre groups and cross curricular activities bring learning to life and enhance the varied and exciting learning environment for all the children

The school also embodies a love of and commitment to Orthodox Judaism and Israel. Hebrew and Jewish Studies underpin the whole educational character of the school. Jewish Studies is taught both as an independent subject and integrated into day-to-day lessons.

The Jewish Studies curriculum aims to develop spirituality and to make the children proud of their Judaism, with the necessary skills and knowledge to continue with their Jewish Studies throughout their secondary education and on into adulthood. Our Reception

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) ensures that children learn through play, as play is vital for children's development. It is through play that young children learn, grow and have fun. It helps them understand the world around them and to develop socially and emotionally. The child is at the centre of the Early Years Foundation Stage and our staff will acknowledge and value your child's interests and abilities, building on them through play.

The children have a daily maths meeting, phonics, English and Maths lessons. Teachers and support staff lead focus group activities across all areas of learning.

All children work at their own individual pace and work is differentiated accordingly. By the end of the year, children will be working at, or ready to start, the Key Stage 1 Curriculum. We ensure that intervention groups and 1:1 support for those children identified with specific learning needs takes place, as well as ensuring support is given to any child who is not making the appropriate progress. We also offer extension opportunities for the most able/gifted and talented pupils.

The Early Years Foundation Stage is comprised of seven areas of learning. Each area of learning and development is implemented through a mix of adult led activities and child initiated play. Our staff will pick up on your child's interests and abilities and build on them through play – ensuring that each individual child reaches their fullest potential.

The Curriculum

Year I - Year 6


We follow the National Curriculum which sets out a clear, full and statutory entitlement to learning for all children aged five to eleven and determines the content of what will be taught. This is preceded by the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum which is taught to children aged three to five.

Core curriculum subjects are:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- ICT (Information and **Communication Technology)**

The Foundation subjects are:

- History
- Geography
- Design and Technology
- Religious Education
- Music
- Art
- Physical Education
- Personal, Social, Health and **Citizenship Education**



Music

Music reflects the culture and society we live in, and so the teaching and learning of music enables children to better understand the world we live in. Besides being a creative and enjoyable activity, music can also be a highly academic and demanding subject. It also plays an important part in helping children feel part of the community.

All children are given opportunities to perform, compose, listen to and appraise music. We encourage pupils to look at new ways of expressing musical ideas through classical music and interactive experiences.

In our dedicated and well-resourced music room the children have access to the following instruments as part of their lessons: violin, African drums, recorder and ukulele.



Art

We believe that Art provides children with a range of quality experiences which captivate and motivate them, allowing them to creatively explore various subjects including many of the topics they are learning in class.

At Sinai we aim to give children a wide variety of high quality art experiences, using a wide range of media for drawing, painting, printing, collage and sculpture that engage and challenge our pupils. Our schemes of work take inspiration from artists, styles and cultures from around the world.

Art is taught in our well-resourced Art room which houses an onsite kiln and a range of mixed media.



Sport

At Sinai we recognise the vital role that PE has to play in promoting a long-term healthy lifestyle that is both enjoyable and rewarding. We aim to provide a high-quality physical education curriculum that inspires all of our pupils to succeed and excel in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities. Physical education is at the forefront of our school culture and we believe this will enhance academic achievement, as well as the health and well-being of our pupils. We have a full time PE teacher who is supported by specialist Sports Coaches to assist in the teaching of Football, Basketball, Tennis, Netball, Swimming and Multisports. Swimming and Multisports. The children also complete the daily mile on a track that loops our MUGA (multi use games area).

We regularly enter sporting competitions, in both local and Jewish leagues, and our full trophy cabinet is a reflection of the high standard of sport at Sinai.

We also offer a variety of lunchtime and after school extracurricular sports clubs for the children, run by external suppliers.





Languages

Learning a foreign language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience in preparation for future life. At Sinai we have a dedicated Modern Foreign Languages teacher and we teach French throughout KS2 in a fun and enjoyable way through choosing interesting and relevant topics that will engage and stimulate learning and develop children's curiosity of language. They sing songs, read stories and perform role-plays.

At Sinai our aim is for children to begin to develop a love of learning a language at primary school, which should encourage them to continue to learn a modern foreign language at secondary school.



Jewish Studies

Hebrew and Jewish Studies underpin the whole educational character of the school and are taught in an interesting and meaningful way, complementing and enriching the secular studies across the school.

Our Jewish Studies curriculum aims to produce children who are proud, confident Jews with the necessary skills and knowledge to play a full part in the Jewish Community.

We aim to create in every child the desire to continue with their Jewish Studies throughout their secondary education and on into adulthood

Children at Sinai have a daily Jewish Studies lesson as well as tefillah and bensching.

Celebrating the festivals is a big part of Sinai life and we welcome parents and grandparents in on a regular basis to share this joy, whether that be for candle lighting at Chanukah, our model Seder at Pesach or Oneg, where we mark Shabbat

SEN Department

We strive to support all children to enable them to achieve at school. In order to do this, many steps are taken to support them through their learning journey. For some children there are occasions when further additional support may be needed to help them to make the best possible progress in school.

Sinai is a fully inclusive school and aims for all pupils achieve their potential, personally, socially, emotionally and academically in all areas of the curriculum (regardless of their gender, ethnicity, social background, religion, sexual identity, physical ability or educational needs).

Children are identified as having SEN when they have a significant learning need or disability which calls for provision to be implemented that is additional to, or different from, the provision that is typically in place for other children of the same age in a mainstream setting. The school, through our dedicated and specially staffed SEN Department, then have specific needs based plans that help support their development and accelerate progress.



Sensory Room & Wellbeing Room

We have a fully equipped sensory room available for all our children to use as a safe and calm space to meditate or take some time for reflection.

We also have a newly created Wellbeing and Therapy Room where our School Counsellor meets with the children under her care. It is a calm and adaptable space used for therapy, relaxation and discussion. By offering a space for the children to relax and think we are enabling them to manage their own stress and wellbeing.








School Council

We believe it is important to listen to our pupils and value the contribution they can give to making decisions about the school. Every year, each class (Y3 to Y6) elects two representatives to the school council.

The Council's aim is to help the school improve in a number of different areas with ideas, comments and suggestions. If children have a comment to make, there is a 'Suggestion' box' in every classroom. Meetings are held regularly in the Conference Room and the Councillors chair and Minute these meetings with guidance from Senior Staff.



Working with Parents

The school welcomes and encourages the active involvement of all parents and regards this as part of the partnership between school and home.

There are plenty of opportunities for Sinai families to come into school and experience the buzz of a school day.

At the beginning of each academic year we hold a launch meeting where parents get to meet the class teachers and learn about the curriculum for that year.

We will regularly update you on your child's progress and host two Parents Evening per year as well as a detailed written report at the end of the school year.

We invite Sinai families in to celebrate Shabbat and the Jewish festivals, such as Chanukah, Pesach and Yom Ha'atzmaut and we are proud to be an open and welcoming school.

We know that children learn best when their parents are fully involved in their education and we ask your help and cooperation in ensuring this work is completed on time, regularly and to a high standard.

We also have plenty of volunteer opportunities for our parents. We have a lively and active PSA (Parent School Association) that put on fundraising events throughout the year and we have two class reps for each class to help disseminate school messages and to speak directly to the Senior Leadership Team.

Extra-Curricular Activities

We are proud to offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities at Sinai. We know that activities outside the classroom are wonderful for building confidence.

Extra-curricular activities which take place outside the school timetable (lunchtime and after school) include:

Ballet, Chess, Drama, Gymnastics, Hip Hop, Karate, Krav Maga, and Tap dance.

Wraparound **Childcare**

We know that working parents often find it difficult to juggle work and the school day. To help our working parents we offer Breakfast Club daily from 8am – 8.30am for the children to enjoy a healthy start to the day, overseen by a Sinai staff member.

We also offer an After School Club (Monday – Thursday) until 5.30pm where children can engage in games, outdoor play or read a book. A light snack is supplied.

Our playground is open every morning from 8.10am to allow parents to drop and go. The school has good transport links and is equidistant from Kingsbury and Preston Road underground stations, with both being only a short walk away.

School Buses

Healthy School

Safeguarding

Visitors, volunteers and parents must only enter through the main entrance and after signing in at our Reception desk.
