Dear Parents & Carers,

Children's Voice - You Said, We Did

This term, we have sought the opinions of children in school as part of our drive for continuous improvement. We are keen to share the findings of the surveys with you and our plans for next steps.

Outcomes from our children's survey were as follows:

- 93% of children said they feel safe at school, with reasons including, "The gates are locked", "Teachers look after us" and "Our friends help to keep us safe"
- 97% of children said they are happy at school and 97% said they have friends to play with
- 100% of children said they knew when they had done something well due to being told by their teachers or friends, getting awards, certificates, effort stickers and pom poms
- 100% of children knew they could speak to a grown up or friend if they were worried or upset
- 96% of children enjoy playing outside in the playground and they had some brilliant suggestions for ways we can improve it
- 97% of children enjoy reading; with 98% enjoying being read to by a range of adults
- 92% of children said they enjoy PE lessons and names a range of activities they enjoyed such as football, cricket, gymnastics and dance

Based on the outcomes of the survey, school will:

- Review our playtime and lunchtime offer to ensure they are as positive and engaging as possible – our children had some good ideas already!
- Continue to develop our reading experience, through new texts, reading areas and special events with a goal of 100% of children enjoying reading for pleasure
- Continue to develop the PE offer within school, to ensure all children are engaged and motivated by this important curriculum area

We hope the information above shows we have listened to your children's views to will continue to work hard to improve our school.
