Foundation Stage should	 Recognise the letters in their name on a computer keyboard and type their name Enter letters <u>and</u> numbers using a word processor Begin to identify the main keys for word processing e.g. space bar, full stop, return key Start using various tools including brushes and pens in a paint package Understand that cameras can take still and moving images (video) Begin to understand that sound can be recorded Aware that documents can be saved and retrieved 	KEYBOARD SPACE BAR FULL STOP RETURN KEY BRUSHES CAMERAS SAVE RETRIEVE

Year 2 should	 Change the text colour/size/font Select and resize an image Type a story/sentences using appropriate keys in a word processor Add sounds within a simple IT package Talk about use of graphics and sound and how it may enhance or change the mood and atmosphere of a presentation and make changes where appropriate Use different layouts and templates for different purposes Become confident using a range of IT programmes Use a digital camera or digital video camera to take appropriate pictures or video for a specific purpose Use appropriate editing tools to improve work – undo, delete, back space, cut, copy, paste.
