Message from Mrs Peart

We have had a wonderful start to the summer term, and this week I was very proud to share our amazing school with two OFSTED inspectors. It has been a long time since our last inspection, but we have continued to work hard to ensure our school is the best that it can be. It was a pleasure to share the work we have been doing in school with the inspectors and they agree that all children are happy, safe and thriving whilst they are with us.

The inspectors were very impressed with all aspects of school provision, particularly children's personal development and the leadership and management of the school. We are now awaiting the draft final report, which we have to agree and the report will then be published for parents. It can take up to 30 days for this to happen, but we will share this with you as soon as we can. I want to say a huge, heartfelt thanks to any parents & carers who spoke with the inspectors or completed the parent survey – the inspector shared with us that we are the only school he has ever inspected where parents made no negative comments about school. We are very proud that all parents are happy with the provision we offer at Sitwell Infants.

I can't believe we are preparing for our final half term with the children for this academic year! Time really has flown by this year. We will be so sad to be losing our Y2 children in the summer. Educational Visits/Visitors

Children in KS1 had a fantastic enrichment visit on Thursday last week where Zoolab came into school for the day. It was so exciting as they brought real life animals with them and the children even got to touch and hold some of them! I was so impressed with how sensible the children were and how much they learned about the animals!

We are very excited to be taking the children out of school on more educational visits next half term. Sunflower, Buttercup & Daisy Classes are going to be visiting Cannon Hall Farm on Tuesday 10th June to find out about a working farm. Rose, Tulip, Bluebell, Poppy & Snowdrop Classes will visit Cleethorpes on Wednesday 18th June. We know these visits will be very memorable for the children. Please make sure you have made your final payment for the visits if you have not yet done so.

Pastoralteam sitwellinfantschool.co.uk to put your name down. Parents will be expected to support and care for a small group of children during the visit and we will be arriving back in Rotherham at 4.30pm when we visit Cleethorpes so only put your name forward if you can do this.

Attendance

As part of our continued work to support families with attendance and punctuality at school, we are looking closely at lateness, both at the beginning and end of the school day. Children should arrive at school and be picked up every day promptly. We log all lateness so that we are able to monitor this and share our concerns with parents if we see a pattern arising. We have had to make the decision that if parents are regularly late to pick their child up from after school provision, they will not be able to attend in the future. Please make sure you are here to collect your child on time every day.

Just a polite reminder that if you are making appointments for your child, please try and do this outside of school time or later in the afternoon as if they miss their mark in a morning, this classes as an absence.

This year, we are below our whole school target of 96% - our attendance is currently 95.1%. Please support us to get closer to our target by the end of the year by sending your child every day!

Wraparound Care

Our wraparound care provision is up and running and the children who are attending are loving the activities on offer each day. If you need wraparound care, you can sign your child up for Breakfast Club in the morning and Tea Club in the afternoon via your Arbor app. Bookings must be made at least 24 hours in advance so that we can make sure we have adequate levels of supervision for the children. Breakfast Club runs from 7.45 – 8.45am each day and Tea Club runs from 3.15 – 5.45pm each day. Breakfast Club is £3 and Tea Club is £10.

We are offering one free taster session for children to attend over the next half term. This way you can sign them up for one or both of the clubs to see if they would like to attend. Please get in touch with reception to do this and we will waive the charge.

We had our class photographs booked in for last Wednesday morning, but they had to be cancelled due to the OFSTED visit. We will let you know once we have secured a new date.

Arbor Parent App

We are now using the Arbor Parent App for all shop payments, club bookings and messages. If you have not yet signed up, please do so as soon as possible to ensure you are receiving messages from us.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

All children in Year 1 will take the Phonics Screening Check at some point during the week beginning 9th June. This is a national assessment, which all schools must undertake. Children will complete the check that week and then the results of this will be shared with you in their Record of Acheivement in July. We will share whether your child has passed the check or not. We are practicing this regularly in school at the moment and a further assessment will be completed this week. We will share information with parents whose children may not be on track so you can support them at home over the next few weeks.

Transition

We are currently finalising our new classes for F2 (Reception) and we will be sending home transition packs for those children by the end of the week. We will send these with siblings in our school and the Juniors. Please make sure to complete the paperwork as soon as possible and bring back to school so we can begin to add them to our system. You will then be able to order uniform etc for them. If you have any questions about this, please get in touch.
